Sonora schools dismiss early

All schools in the Sonora Independent School District will dismiss at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday, November 23 for the Thanksgiving holidays. Buses are scheduled to run shortly thereafter.

Classes will resume with the regular schedule Monday, November 28.

City Councilmen protest request

West Texas Utilites requested a 19 percent retail rate increase for the city with the city councilmen voting unanimously to deny it at the regular city council meeting Wednesday, November 16 at 9 a.m. in city hall

WTU also placed a hearing request with the PUC and has requested a wholesale rate increase of nine percent with the FERC.

One city official stated that it would be beneficial for the Sonora citizens to get on the city's electrical system. He also said that it would help keep the money here in Sonora, get rid of the dangerous spiderweb of electrical lines, and eliminate the dual power structure.

He also pointed out that the rate increase is not controlled by the city of Sonora, but by federal standards

In other action, the city council approved a bid from Sonora Ford Sales of \$10,930 for a 1984 four-door sedan to be used as a police vehicle. Another bid was accepted from Chaparral Motors for a 1984 Chevrolet pickup to be used by the city.

Also discussed by the council was the distribution of pamphlets concerning mobile home standards throughout Sonora. During the discussion, it was mentioned that these laws should either be enforced or not passed. It was decided that the laws could be enforced by first giving notice to the mobile home owner, then action could be taken to enforce the law that was being

Other business included some general comments from E.O. Cambern and George Spivey, representatives of General Telephone, the acceptance of a plat from the Henry Mata subdivision, a discussion by Russell Adkins concerning the parking situation on Concho Street in front of the library, and the ratification of Quade Sutton for the appointment to the Sutton


County Tax Appraisal Board.

The city aldermen also considered the proposals for the selection of professional services with respect to the city's participation in the Texas Community Development program.

Other business of interest was the discussion concerning the proposed drainage correction for the crossing at Cornell Street. It was decided to add another culvert and place a concrete apron in front of it to keep the weeds from growing up and clogging the drainage.

The city councilmen also discussed Ordinance Number 258 and requested bid proposals for a three year term of insurance coverage for employees of the city.

Officials attending Wednesday's meeting included Jim Dover, city manager; David Wallace, city attorney; Billy Gosney, mayor; and Aldermen Lemuel Lopez, Bill Keel, Matt Davenport, and Hershel Davenport.

Sonora receives \$28,907.04

State Comptroller Bob Bullock recently sent city sales tax rebate checks a full week early because many taxpayers paid by the 20th of last month-as all taxpayers will be required to do this month.

"We're sending these checks early because 134,000

Texas taxpayers paid before the deadline," Bullock said. "This kind of cooperation among taxpayers is helping us avoid new and high taxes. It's obvious this change will help local governments put these tax revenues to work faster in their cities."

Starting in November, all taxpayers will be required to file by the 20th of the month instead of by the last day of the month.

The earlier deadline set by the Legislature will bring

The earlier deadline set by the Legislature will bring in \$500 million more for the current state budget without a tax increase.

Bullock said this month's early payments "show that Texas merchants have accepted this change in the same spirit it was suggested--to save us from a tax increase." Bullock's office has been working with trade and professional organizations to inform taxpayers of the

November 4 was \$28,907.04. The comparable payment for the prior year was \$45,815.44. The 1983 payments to date total \$214,705.86 and the 1982 payments to date totaled \$338,789.76. The 1983 figure is 36.63 percent less than the 1982 figure.

Houston received the biggest check, for \$19 million,

compared with \$18.5 million for the same period last year. Dallas got \$12 million, compared with \$10.9 million last November.

San Antonio's check was for \$6.1 million, compared with \$5.2 million for the same period last year.

Austin's payment of \$4 million pushed its 1983 total payments to \$26.4 million, up 15.7 percent over the total by this time last year. Fort Worth's payment was for \$3.5 million, bringing that city's 1983 year-to-date payments to \$24.6 million, up 5.3 percent over 1982.

Bullock also sent checks to the state's two Metropolitan Transit Authorities. Houston's MTA check for \$22.4 million pushed its 1983 total payments to \$147.6 million. San Antonio's MTA check was \$3.5 million, bringing 1983 payments to \$22 million.

He noted that smoking is often associated with lung cancer and chronic lung diseases because the link between cigarette smoke and those diseases has been known for years. Knowledge of the relationship between smoking and heart disease is more recent.

The first official statement by AHA on smoking issued in 1956 emphasized

smoking and increased death rates from coronary heart disease."

After reviewing scientific evidence over a period of 25 years, AHA's latest statement issued in 1980 said that "evidence incriminating smoking in heart and blood vessel diseases is substantial and unequivocal."

Dr. Mitchell said there is considerable evidence now of medicine and physiology that cigarette smokers are at the University of Texas more likely than nonsmokers to have hardening Dallas. He also is the of the arteries of the heart

conclusions can be drawn as well as the main artery, concerning possible relationships between tabacco smokers is more likely to be worse than in non-smokers.

'Also there is evidence now to show that persons who smoke a pack of cigarettes a day have more than twice the risk of heart attack than a person who has never smoked. And the risk for a smoker of more than a pack of cigarettes a day is three times greater,' Dr. Mitchell said.

the Weinberger Laboratory for Cardiopulmonary Research.

"Giving up the cigarette habit," said the American Heart Association president, "can substantially reduce the hazard of heart disease. And 10 years after quitting, the risk of death from heart disease is almost the same as if the person had never smoked."



Texas oil production rate for December 1983 at 100 percent of market demand.

Chairman Mack Wallace and Commissioners Buddy Temple and Jim Nugent directed the continuance of the top production allowable after reviewing oil companies' nominations to buy a total of 2,381,804 barrels of Texas oil per day. The December nomination total, a decrease of 5,074 barrels daily when compared to October purchaser nominations, indicates market demand.

Although next month's state total for the permissible rate of reduction is calculated to average 2,857,249 barrels per day, actual production is estimated to reach 2.3 million barrels per day. Actual production is December 1982 was 2,351,610 barrels of oil per day. December 1982 nominations totaled 2,463,231 barrels

The Commission first went to the ceiling level for oil production in April 1972, and December marks the 82nd month in a row for the maximum allowable. It applies to fields in the state except those that are assigned lower legal rates of production so that reservoir pressures will not be depleted before the maximum amount of oil has been recovered.

Wallace also reported that December 1983 nominations for the purchase of Texas gas totaled 21,281,050 Mcf/d (thousand cubic cubic feet of gas per day). November gas nominations totaled 20,530,672 22,382,896 Mcf/d.

The next statewide oil and gas production allowable hearing will begin at 9 a.m. Tuesday, December 20, in Room 107 of the Railroad Commission headquarters building at 1124 S. IH 35 in Austin.







Some "gift" mail-order meats okay

Mail-order gift packages of smoked cured ham, bacon, sausage or turkey are increasingly popular holiday gifts.

But those receiving smoked meats may wonder about its quality and edibility after weeks in storage and transit, says a Texas A and M University Agrigult-ural Extension Service nutritionist.

'Mail-order gift packages from reputable dealers are safe for consumption, so you need not worry about giving them as gifts or using them yourself," advises Marilyn Haggard, a foods and nutrition special-

"The products are highly processed and contain preservatives, allowing them to be mailed without refrigeration," she explains.

But the meats should still be inspected before eating, cautions Haggard. After opening the package, look for signs of spoilage such as a rotten or putrid smell. Foods with a questionable odor should not be used or even tasted.

Also inspect the food for signs of surface mold growth. Mold of this type is not poisonous but must be removed before the meat is used, says the specialist.

According to Haggard, you can trim off any mold and the meat directly under it, or scrub the mold off with a brush and vinegar wash. A vinegar wash can be made by mixing one part vinegar to three parts water. Rinse the wash off with plain water.

For maximum flavor from smoked cured meat, Haggard recommends rapid use. Bacon can be stored in a refrigerator at 35 to 40 degrees F for seven days. A whole ham can be refrigerated for seven days, a half for three to five days and slices for three days.

Smoked sausage keeps well when refrigerated for up to seven days and dry or semi-dry sausage and cured smoked turkey will keep for two to three

Since frozen cured meat loses quality rapidly, you should not plan on long freezer storage, says Hag-gard. Bacon should be frozen at zero degrees F for one month or less and ham for only one to two month. Turkey can be frozen for three to six months, but freezing is not recommended for sausage.

Cured meats are safe when frozen for longer periods of time, but there may be a drop-off in taste that makes the gifts less enjoyable, notes the spe-





Credit card frauds told

A boming business in bank credit card fraud means consumers need to be careful about credit purchases during the hectic holiday shopping season, says home economist Nancy Granovsky.

The most common fraud is unauthorized use of a lost or stolen card, says Granovsky, a specialist with the Texas A & M University Agricultural Extension Ser-

Counterfeit cards, the theft of card blanks and card numbers obtained through telephone orders are used in more sophisticated frauds, she explains.

To protect credit cards she suggests that consumers take the following

When shopping, be careful about the carbons on charge slips since they can be used to change amounts on the charge slip. Make sure the sales person removes the carbon after the slip has been signed, or remove it yourself along with the customer's copy.

Avoid giving your credit card number over the

phone if at all possible. Keep all charge slips so you can check your statement to make sure each charge is legitimate. If some are fraudulent, call the card issuer immediate-

Know the law. You are liable only for the first \$50 charged to your account by an illegal user. You do not have to pay for any un-authorized charges made after you notify the card company of loss or theft of your card. So if you act quickly enough, you may not have any loss.

Keep a credit card register listing all your credit cards, account numbers and the address or telephone number of who to notify in case of loss or theft. Keep this list in a safe place, such as a safety deposit hox.

Carry with you only those cards you need. For example, don't carry a department store credit card unless you intend to shop there. Leave a list of the cards you have with you at home.

'Some consumers buy credit card insurance which may be unnecessary if they will take reasonable precautions," says Granovsky.

Rain helped grasses after drought

The slow, steady and substantial rainfall which blanketed much of west central Texas during the latter part of October, provided needed moisture for drought ravaged pastures, according to Ed Huston, animal nutritionist for the Texas A. and M. Agricultural Research Center in San Angelo.

Huston said the rain, which broke a year-long drought in some areas, was enough to generate growth for cool season grasses. However, he noted, the rain came too late in the season to stimulate warm season grass growth.

"Areas that rely on grasses that are normally dormant by mid-autumn will not realize as much from the rain until spring,"
Huston explained. "The native grass pastures on the rangeland are a mixture of both kinds of seasonal



U·S· Senate votes "no" on decontrol

The United States Senate voted no on natural gas decontrol and against rolling back gas prices. The vote to decontrol gas was 28 for and 67 against.





Benefits told

Social Security widow's and widower's benefits can now be paid for the month the worker dies even if the widow(er) cannot file an application for benefits until the following month, announced Franklin Upp, Manager of the San Angelo Social Security Office.

It is often difficult for a widow(er) to contact a Social Security Office in the same month the worker dies. A recent change in the Social Security Law allows the payment of benefits for the month the worker dies, even if the application is not filed until the month following the month of the worker's death, Upp added. This change was effective for applications filed in

July 1983 or later. However, if the widow(er)'s application is filed later than the month of the worker's death, benefits can only begin with the month the application is filed.
