



# Quit or Discharge? A critical distinction

Dear Commissioner Nabers:

An employee of ours went on vacation last week. Before she left, she told me and another manager that when she returned, she would give notice of quitting. Based upon what she told us, we replaced her. She is returning this week. Where do we as the employer stand? We know we need documentation, so we will probably ask her to sign a resignation letter.

Dear Sir:

There were some pitfalls in your situation. Whether the TEC decides that the work separation was voluntary or involuntary will depend entirely upon what the employee said about her intention to leave. If she actually said she would leave by a certain date, the TEC will probably rule that her leaving was voluntary. However, if she gave no date for quitting, but only said she might quit at some unspecified point in the future, the TEC might decide that the work separation occurred involuntarily when the employer replaced the claimant during her vacation. Another problem could arise with the resignation, then the TEC could most likely consider that to be a constructive

discharge, instead of a voluntary quit. If the employee volunteers to write a letter of resignation, then the reverse would hold true. In general, the employer should be sure of itself before proceeding upon what may be only a vague statement that a future resignation is possible.

Dear Commissioner Nabers:

This morning one of our data entry clerks was arrested at work on a warrant for writing too many insufficient checks. She had known about the checks bouncing, but had not taken care of them. She has now missed a day of work, and we don't think we should keep her as an employee. Where do we stand if we discharge her?

Dear Bank:

If the employee files a claim for unemployment benefits, the

TEC will investigate why she was discharged. Among other things, it will want to know whether the bank has a written policy against employees writing bad checks. However, this case would be somewhat more straightforward, since this involves an arrest at the work place on a criminal charge. In cases in which a claimant was discharged for disruption of the work place or absence resulting from an arrest on criminal charges, the TEC then inquires whether the claimant was at fault in the arrest. Fault can be shown by such things as a conviction for the offense, a guilty or non contest plea, a sentence of deferred adjudication, or simple admission to the TEC that the charge was true. If the claimant was at fault in the arrest, and the arrest caused an absence or disruption, generally the TEC will disqualify the claimant from benefits, and the employer's account will not be charged.

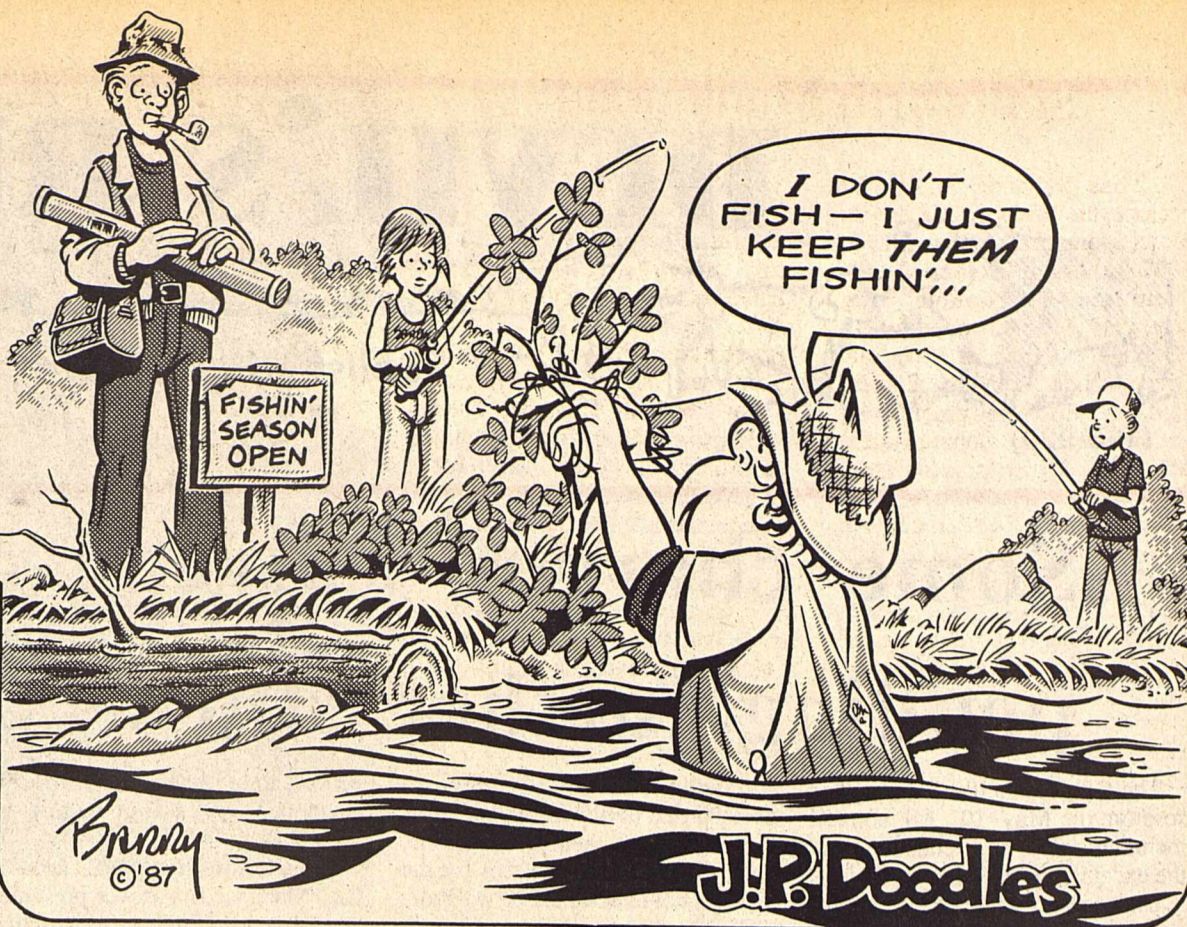

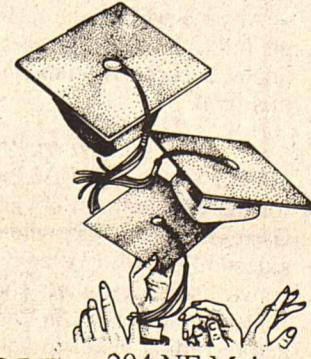

founded was May 19, 1890 and since it was the town selected by popular vote as county seat on November 3, 1890, and since the Diamond Jubilee was celebrated in 1965. It will also be the celebration of 100 years of Sutton County history although the county actually created by the Legislature of 1887 by House Bill Number 387 entitled "An Act to Create the Counties of Sutton and Schleicher from the County of Crockett."

The town's roots actually came to life earlier than 1890 with two events, both concerning water - that life saving fluid without which any birth is extremely difficult; the first in 1881 when Ed Wall and Tom Birtrong, on a hunting expedition from Ft. McKavett discovered the well still known today as Wall's Well; the second in 1889 when a water well was drilled on the courthouse square.

As a part of that Centennial Celebration it is planned that a drama reliving the birth and the ensuing 100 years growth and development of Sonora and Sutton County will be staged in an outdoor amphitheater. Preparatory to that full production in 1990 there will be outdoor productions on a smaller scale during the summers of 1987,88 and 89.

The 1987 production, a Dinner Theater, will take place 8 miles west of Sonora on I-10 at the Caverns of Sonora, Sutton County's already popular tourist attraction. It is hoped the Dinner Theater will be an additional attraction for the tourist and for townspeople in the surrounding areas as well. More than a dozen local "Storytellers" and talented entertainers will perform during this summer season, and since no two performances will be alike, it is hoped that each evening will be a sell out.

In an old west setting repleat with covered wagon, horse and rider, redwood tables and bales of hay nestled in the shade of a mesquite grove, a sing-a-long (Old West variety) will be held at 6:00 p.m. each evening for the early arrivers. The chuck wagon style, western meal will begin at 6:30, allowing those who are taking the 5:30 Caverns tour to be served at approximately 7:00 p.m.

Each Friday and Saturday evening from June 26 through August 15 a different "Old Timer" will be ready to regale his or her listeners with tales of the Old West at 7:30 p.m. Those performances will be iced by some of the areas sweetest in entertainment, Los Solitarios, a troupe of "Western" ballerinas, Ft. Concho Infantry and Cavalry troops, The Eldorado Town Band, Ballet Folklorico, The Kountry Kickers, The Outlaws, Olive Hays of the San Angelo Jazz Band and other talented groups and individuals.

The setting at the Caverns could not be a more fitting one for this production aimed at portraying the history and culture of the "Old Days" of Sonora, Sutton County and vicinity. It was these very hills over which the Comanches, the Lipan and Tonkaway Indians rode during the mild, pleasant winters and during the summers long ago when the sun went down from a clear blue sky as it does now. It was to these hills the ranchers came herding their grazing sheep. It was in these hills Ed Wall and Tom Birtrong discovered the water well, so cleverly concealed by the Indians in earlier times, which led to the founding of

Sutton County. It was under these hills that Mother Nature etched a cavern and decorated almost every square inch of it with jewels and chandeliers to be hidden beyond the enjoyment of public eyes until 1979. And it is fitting that at these performances the audiences will join in singing in the song of the cowboy, of the frontier soldier, of the pioneer who tamed the land, and of the Spaniard who first knew the land and whose language gave it its name.

It is the desire of the Outdoor Drama Group that these performances will entertain, entrall, excite, enliven, enamor, enable, endear and endure.

Tickets for these performances are available at the Sonora Chamber of Commerce, the Devil's River News, the Caverns of Sonora, Ol' Sonora Trading Company, Sutton County Steakhouse and Westerman's Drugs. Season tickets (theater only) are \$14.95 allowing the holder to attend all performances. Holders of season tickets may make reservations for dinner by calling Sutton County Steakhouse. Only limited number of dinner tickets will be available at the gate each evening. The dinner tickets are \$5.95 for adults and \$3.95 for children.

The Caverns is offering its special group rate of \$4.00 for adults and \$3.00 for children to holders of any Dinner Theater ticket. Some local merchants are also offering special discounts to holders of Dinner Theater tickets.

The final performances of the Covered Wagon Dinner Theater will be held in conjunction with Sutton County Days on the courthouse lawn. Watch for future announcements about these performances.
