The QMB program is run by the Health Care Financing Administration, the federal agency
that runs Medicare, and Department of Human Services. Under QMB, state Medicaid programs are required to pay Medicare medical insurance (Part B) premiums, deductibles and
copayments for certain elderly and copayments for certain elderly and
disabled persons with low incomes and very limited assets.
Generally, to qualify for the QMB program in 1992, you must: be entitled to Medicare hospital insurance (Part A); have an annual
income at or below the national income at or below the national
poverty level; not have resources such as bank accounts, stocks and bonds in excess of $\$ 4,000$ ( $\$ 6,000$ for a couple). The national poverty levels for 1992 are $\$ 6,810$ for an individual and $\$ 9,190$ for a family
