such as power lines such as power lines or automobiles.
5. Keep a bucket of water rearby 5. Keep a bucket of water nearby
while setting off fireworks. Use while setting off fireworks. Use
the water to douse any malfunctioning fireworks or
accidental fires and to immerse accidental fires and to immerse minor burns. Also use this bucke
of water for disposing of of water for disposing of used
sparklers.
6. Keep everyone, especially
children under 15 years old, a safe distance away from the area where the fireworks are ignited.
7. Read and follow the directions

8. Never touch a firework after it has been lit. If the firework malfunctions, do not try to relight used fireworks with water.
9. Never experiment with fireworks. Don't take fireworks apart or mix anything with the
contents. Never make fireworks at contents. Never make fireworks at
home. Don't set off fireworks in home. Dont set off fireworks in containers. 10. After you have finished
lighting fireworks, cool the remain with water. Thors, cool the remains fireworks materials and put them in a metal container. Cover with
water again to reduce the chance of an accidental fire
