#### Stavley speaks to Lions Club

Charles Stavley, Small/Rural Communities Liaison for the Texas Water Commission spoke Tuesday to the Sonora Lion's Club.

Stavley encouraged Sonora Lions that Municipal Solid Waste Land Fill (MSWLF's) rules west of the "25 inch Rain Fall Line" were not quite as restrictive but that revised land fill criteria would ensure that MSWLF's facilities are designed and operated in a manner that is protective of human health and environment.

Stavley quoted some statistics like; Texas moves 19.2 million tons of municipal Solid Waste per year. Three million tons of Texas waste is grass which could be composted.

He raised a thought provoking question...Would Sonora be willing to Compost? If the diapers used yearly were stacked end to end an extension to the moon and back would be made 7 times.

Stavley also acknowledged the up and coming controversy of land fills

#### Two EMS members attend special training

Members of the Sutton County Emergency Medical Service were among about 200 attendees of a special training course on Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD), June 25-28 in Austin. The course was sponsored by the Texas Department of Health (TDH).

CISD is a type of counseling for emergency workers in which fellow personnel in that field and mental health professionals guide a group discussion about stressful incidents, such as multiple deaths in a short period of time or other trauma incident situations. Experts estimate about 25 percent of EMS personnel leave their profession in four years because of such stress. Law Enforcement, firemen, dispatchers, and other emergency workers of this type also have a large "burnout" rate.

CISD course graduates from Sutton County were Ben Pool and Lenora Pool. Both received a scholarship to attend this course from the Texas Department of

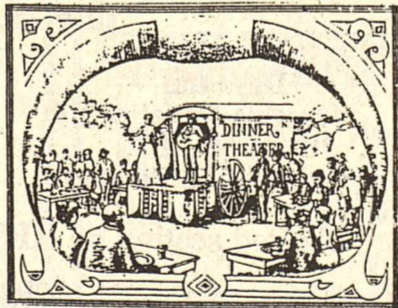

#### Commissioners hear ball park complaints

The Sutton County Commissioners Court heard a presentation on Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) during a regular meeting held Monday.

Virgil Poloczek with the Soil & Water Conservation District, made the presentation in order to acquaint county officials with RC&D. The purpose of the group as stated in a general information pamphlet supplied by RC&D is to accelerate the conservation, development, and utilization of natural resources to improve the general level of economic activity and to enhance the environment and standard of living in authorized RC&D Areas.

In other business, what started out as a heated discussion between commissioners and Sonora City League officials, ended with solutions to problems that should appease both sides.

Chandra Hughes and Bill Cascadden spoke for the league and expressed problems that had arisen due to the new fencing of the ball park area. Ms. Hughes explained that prior to a recent tournament

that was held at the park, Commissioner Barrera had instructed several workers including herself to move their vehicles out of the area. She explained that it was necessary to enter the gates in order to unload equipment and supplies needed for the tournament and the vehicles were moved after they were unloaded.

County Judge Carla Garner said that in the future parents in charge of the league activities should come to the commissioners meeting a few weeks before the season begins. This would allow everyone to know who might need to enter the area for loading purposes and prevent any problems that may arise.

A request by the Sonora City League was also made for assistance in improvements of the ball parks.

Awnings over the bleachers are needed and the league is able to do the work with the help of volunteers, however, assistance with the purchase of materials was requested.

My name is Mrs. Billie Barber. I am 88 years old and lived in Sonora and attended the old rock school some 78 years ago. My cousins lived in Sonora and I lost track of them about 25 years ago. Can you help me find them? Their names were A. M. and Edna Cunningham and they had a son named Charles. I remember Professor Peck, Buzzy Stokes, Haynie Davis, A. C. Frambough and Benina Balch, L. P. Bloodworth and Ida Halbert. Rita Merck was one of my best friends, Cudge Hurst, Zola Parker and Fred Jungk, Laura Word and many other people I still remember from when I lived there in 1914, 1915 and 1916. My name then was Willie Eastwood, and we later moved to Ozona maybe some people will remember me, maybe not because I've outlived a whole lot of people.

After a phone call to Mrs. Barber in Mineral Wells and phone calls to Sam Odom, John Eaton, Joseph Vander Stucken, Lea Roy Valliant, and finally Ralph Mayer we found that A. M. (Slim) Cunningham, whose last employment in Sutton

We have given Mrs. Barber Slim's number in Brady and she will be in touch with him. If any of our readers remember Billie Barber a. k. a. She would love to hear from people in Sonora and hear stories of what happened during the lives of a lot of people she used to know. Maybe she could even help you with stories about your parents or grandparents. She is a very nice lady and I am sure you would enjoy corresponding with her.

Beginning Thursday July 30 through August 13 Family Nights will be held from 6:30 - 8:00 p. m. Children must be accompanied by parent or parents.

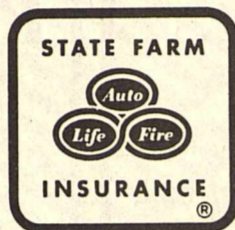
Monday, August 10 will be a day from 1st, 2nd and 3rd graders. The pool will be set aside for them from 10:30 a. m. until 12 noon.

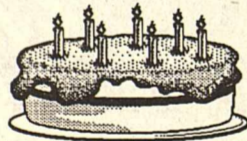

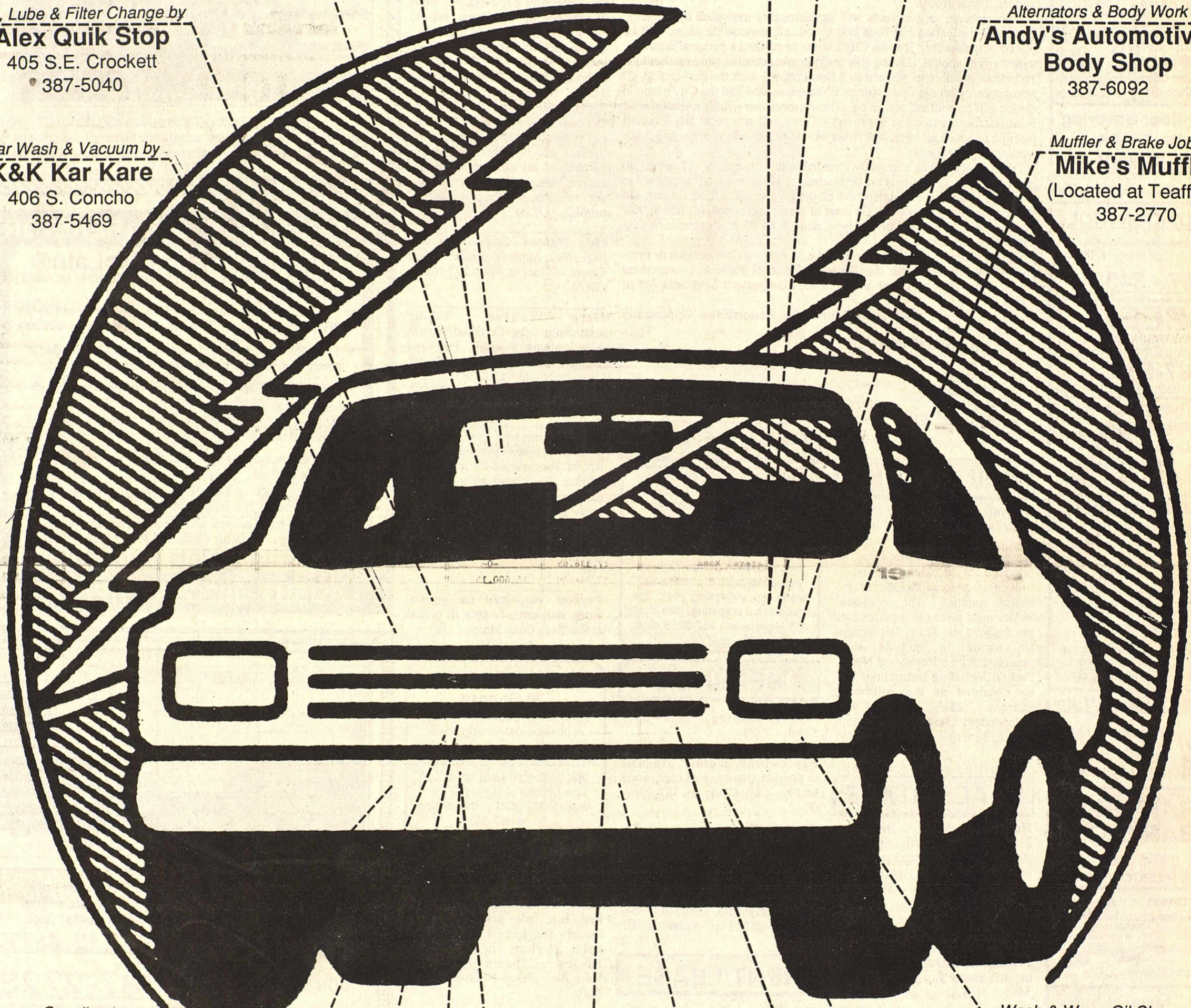
