They stopped at windmill to get a drink, and whil here one of the horses started of started to catch him when the hors he was riding stepped on a rolling stone. The saddle girth broke and the rider was powerless to save
himself. He fell and the horse rolled over on him and the saddle detached. In moments of explanation of the accident Mr. Powers could give.
