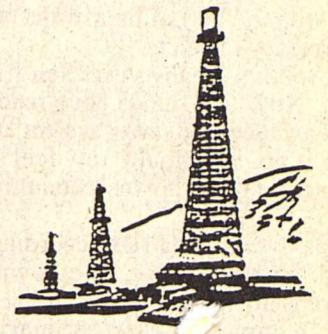

Trooper Ortiz nets \$160,000 worth of controlled substance

DPS Trooper Norbert Ortiz was on routine patrol 3 miles south of Sonora on U. S. 277, Monday, January 4, 1993. Ortiz detected speed and equipment violations on two north bound vehicles.

Ortiz intended to stop both vehicles, but was unable to stop the lead vehicle. Upon stopping the 1988 Ford Mustang driven by Daryl Duwayne Douglas, 28, of Clute, Texas, Ortiz realized both vehicles were traveling together.

Ortiz contacted Sonora Police Officer Mike Routh. Routh was able to stop the 1990 Toyota Pickup 1/2 east of Sonora on U. S. 290.

While Ortiz talked to Douglas he detected an odor of burning marijuana emanating from Douglas' vehicle.

The 1990 Toyota driven by Juan Gomez Gallando 42, of Del Rio and the 1988 Mustang were escorted to the Highway Patrol Office by Trooper Ortiz and Police Officer Mike Routh.

Ortiz said "Written consent to search both vehicles was obtained from the drivers."

Ortiz discovered in the backseat area of the 1988 Mustang two extra large burlap feed sacks. Inside the

burlap sacks were six compressed, cellophane wrapped square blocks of green leafy substance, believed to be marijuana.

An extensive search of the '88 Mustang was conducted by Ortiz when he discovered in the backseat floorboard a round cellophane-wrapped ball weighing 10 pounds, also known marijuana.

The 1990 Toyota was also searched but no further contraband was located by the officers.

Charged with aggravated possession of marijuana were Daryl Duwayne Douglas, Develin Rey Bull, 23 year old female of Clute, Texas; Robin Ann Hurst, 23 year

old female of Lake Jackson. Juan Gomez Gallando, 42 and Juan Najeria Gallando, Jr., 23, both of Del Rio were also charged.

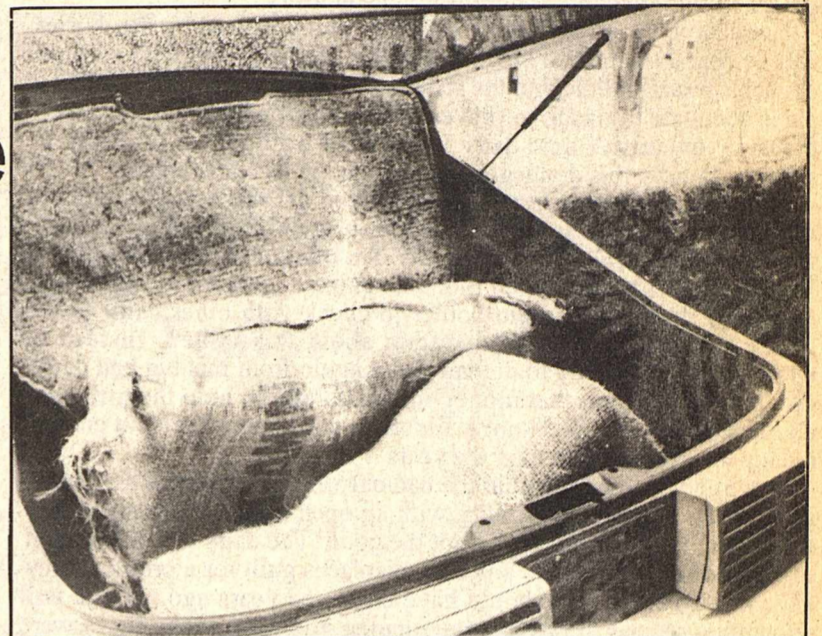
All five were magistrates and booked into the Sutton County Jail. Their bond was set at \$50,000 each.

The 1988 Mustang was seized by the Department of Public Safety.

Estimated street value of the controlled substance is \$160,000.

According to Trooper Ortiz all five had made bond on January 6, 1993.

Tuesday, the 160 pounds of marijuana was delivered to the DPS Crime Lab in Midland.

Accidents keep THP Officers busy

Alcohol was considered to be a factor in two separate accidents that occurred in Sutton County over the weekend.

On January 9 Linda Lee Carroll, age 31, driving a 1984 Ford was traveling South to Sonora on Miers Rd. at approximately 10:10 p.m. when she failed to negotiate a curve and left the roadway. She then struck a telephone pole, knocking it down.

Alcohol and excessive speed were contributing factors according to a report filed by Trooper Don Van Zandt. No seat belt was worn and no injuries were reported.

At 2:30 a.m. on January 10, Trooper L.D. Whitton was called to the scene of a major accident on Bond Rd. two miles south of

Sonora.

Robert Antonio Zapata, 19, of Sonora was traveling north in a 1979 Chevrolet pickup when he failed to negotiate a curve. Zapata's vehicle left the roadway and went into the pasture where he became airborne over a ditch and hit an embankment head on. The vehicle landed upright.

Trooper Whitton reported that alcohol and a high rate of speed were factors in the accident.

Zapata received serious injuries and was taken to Hudspeth Memorial Hospital by Sutton County Ambulance and later transferred to a San Angelo Hospital.

Zapata was not wearing a safety belt when the accident occurred.

A total of nine accidents on Interstate 10 were reported Sunday by Texas Highway Patrol Officers Ruben Terrones, L.D. Whitton, and Don Van Zandt. All were attributed to icy weather conditions and unsafe speed.

In the most severe case reported, the Sonora Fire Department Rescue Unit and two ambulances were called to the scene of a two vehicle accident shortly before midnight Sunday.

Jiries Atallah, 30, of Scottsdale, Arizona was traveling east on I-10 when he struck a trailer belonging to Maria Guadalupe Gonzalez, 24, of El Paso. Guadalupe's vehicle

had become disabled after it slid into a guardrail only moments before.

Upon striking Guadalupe's trailer, Atallah's vehicle then veered to the right and struck a guardrail. Occupants of the vehicle were trapped and the rescue unit was called.

Once the victims were released from the vehicle they were transported by Sutton County Ambulance to Hudspeth Memorial Hospital.

According to a report by Trooper Don Van Zandt, all occupants were wearing safety belts.

James has seen many changes within the department. The two most notable were the change in the way firemen are called to a fire. They once depended on an outside alarm, then later fire phones were installed, and now they have 911 and pagers.

The number of ambulance runs for the month of December were down somewhat. Total runs in November were 25; December only saw 21. During the calendar year 1992 the Sutton County E. M. S. made a total of 263 runs. They are broken down as follows: Illnesses, 174; Accidents, 78; and Patients refusing treatment, 11.

Of the above patients with injuries, 29 were transferred to an out of town hospital.

The "response" times averages are

as follows: response time, 8 minutes; time at scene, 12 minutes; and time from the scene to the hospital, 49 minutes. These averages can be a little misleading in that many of the illnesses and injuries were later transferred to a hospital in San Angelo, or some other city.

The runs for the month of December, 1992 are as follows: illnesses, 11; injuries, 7; and patients refusing treatment, 3 with a total of 21.

ASCS news

ACP - CONSERVATION SIGN-UP -- Under sign up provisions for the Annual Program (ANA) for conservation work, producers may now apply for cost sharing. Applications are approved on the basis of "Need" to correct a conservation problem. Practices available to county producers include brush control, livestock water wells, pipelines, water storage tanks, and cross fencing. Applications may be made by coming to the ASCS office.

The County Committee has established application review dates for ACP-annual practices. Applications will be reviewed three times a year; in March, July, and September of each calendar year. Applications received in the ASCS Office by February 12, 1993 will be reviewed at the March County Committee meeting.

WOOL AND MOHAIR PROGRAM - Producers are urged to report 1992 wool and mohair "sales" documents before January 31, 1993. Late filed documents can no longer be accepted by the County ASCS Office. You will

need to bring in head counts, shearing dates, grading charges, charges for freight to the warehouse - if any, and any unshorn lamb purchases. If you have purchased unshorn lambs we will need the sale sheet showing the number of head and weight of lambs you bought.

Producers who have not done so, must come to the ASCS office to fill out the required CCC-502, Payment Limitation forms and AD-1026's, Land Determination forms before January 32, 1993 so that required determinations may be completed. PROGRAM PAYMENTS CANNOT BE MADE UNTIL REQUIRED FORMS AND DETERMINATIONS ARE COMPLETE.

"ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION IN ALL PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY ASCS IS ESTABLISHED UNDER LAW WITHOUT REGARD TO RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, AGE, SEX, MARITAL STATUS, DISABILITY, OR NATIONAL ORIGIN."

All those interested in becoming 4-H clothing leaders need to attend. If you are unable to attend or have

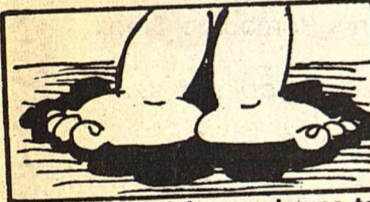

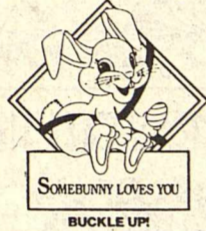
Tiger Cub news

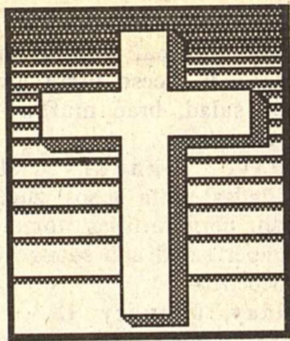
