## City upgrades recycling center

The City of Sonora has
completed an upgrading of its completed an upgrading of its recycling center with the addition
of new color-coded receptacles and signs. The improvements at the center, located at the intersection of Water and Third Streets, are a part of the city's renewed efforts to encourage

Currently, the center accepts
aluminum aluminum cans, tin cans, clear glass, brown glass, and green
glass glass. As markets for additional recyclable materials are developed within the region, the recycling station will be expanded to accept other types of
materials.
"The benefits to recycling are Manager John Pape explained.
"Not only is it the thing to to, it reduces the amount of waste that needs to be collected and put into the landfill. This can translate into a longer
life for the landfill and reduced operating costs."
Pape noted that the amount of garbage has increased by 60 percent since 1960, while during
the same time period the number the same time period the number of operating landfills decreased
from 20,000 to 6,500 . He also from 20,000 to 6,500 . He also
noted that new federal regulations could close nearly half the existing of the remaining landfill by 1994, and recycling is an effective way of conserving landfill space and extending the life of the landfill by reducing the
amount of municipal solid waste.

Wedding bells mean wedding bills

With the romance, excitement and nervousness of spring fancies and June brides, a couple
can easily lose track financial aspect of a wedding. An average formal wedding costs more than $\$ 13,000$ and may run two to three times that
amount. Even a small, informal wedding runs up bills quickly. For spring or summer weddings, planning has already begun. But it's too late to get control of spending associated with the big day. Start your
budget by writing down the expected cost of items already planned. Add any other anticipated expenses and expect unplanned costs to occur For those just beginning to
plan, set a tentative budget for plan, set a tentative budget or

changing. Many couples today
pay for their own weddings or share costs equally between

greenery, while another greenery, while another
anticipates elaborate decorations. anticcussies elaborate it beforehand eases tensions later.

Allowing plenty of time can save money and tempers. Printers are likely to charge extra
for "RUSH" orders on for "RUSH" orders on
invitations or announcements. Low-cost facilities or service providers may be booked up for your wedding date if you wait too late to schedule. Starting early allows you to buy the bride's, groom's, and attendants' attire on lay-away, budgeting you money as you go.
Be sure to get all arrangements in writing. While you may view your wedding with romantic illusions, it is business to service providers. Make sure you know your obligation in case of
changes or cancellations, get written quotes on costs and keep receipts for any deposits or early payments.
After setting up your budget,
review it regularly. Look at it weekly at first and daily as the wedding date nears. As expenses mount, see if you can anticipate
unexpected
and preven
expenses or compensate for them by cutting down somewhere else. Evaluate whether you can pay some costs ahead of time to save finance which will need to be paid later If expenses are getting out of hand, discuss whether some items can be cut form the budget to save money.

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals.
You may follow these procedures if you have a concern about: You may follow these procedures if you have a concern about:
-the value placed on your property;

- exemplions that may apply to you;
-whether your property is taxable
- which local governments should be taxing your property; or
-you think the appraisal district has done something else that adversely affected you
Informal Review: For an informal review of your property value, contact, Rex Ann Friess, Chief Appraiser, at the appraisal district office located at 300 E . Oak St.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board:
If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board.
The appraisal review board (ARB) 'is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with
appraisals and other concerns listed above It has the pord appraisals and other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the
necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive writte notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will mak its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisa district office at 300 E. Oak, St., Sonora, Texas 76950 .
Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outsi
sign an affidavit saying that you haven't done so before the ARB hears your case
Review by the District Court: After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision you have the right to appeal to distric urt. If you choose to go to court, you must start the proce the date you receive the ARB's order.
The appraisal district has appraised your property at $\$ 1,000,000$ or more, you must file a notice o

Deadline for filing protests with the ARB
(The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.)
Usual Deadline
On or before May 31 ( or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reaso beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause. Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year.
Contact your appraisal district for more information.

## Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisa
because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30 th day after the notice of determination was mailed to you.
For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of th determination was mailed to you.
If you believe the appraisal
If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before the taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decide
