Burnam to Erith Hawkins. Mrs. Norwood and her mother went to Dimmitt Thursday for the Old Timer's Reunion.

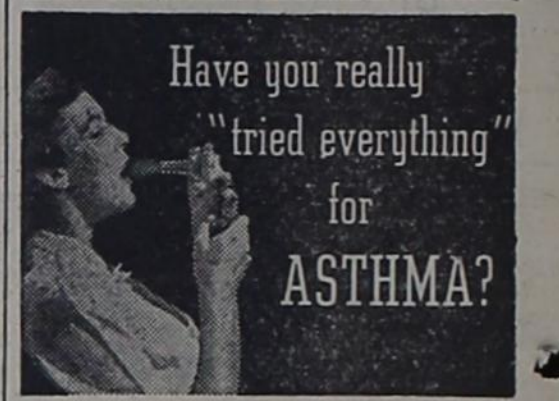
Have Quilting

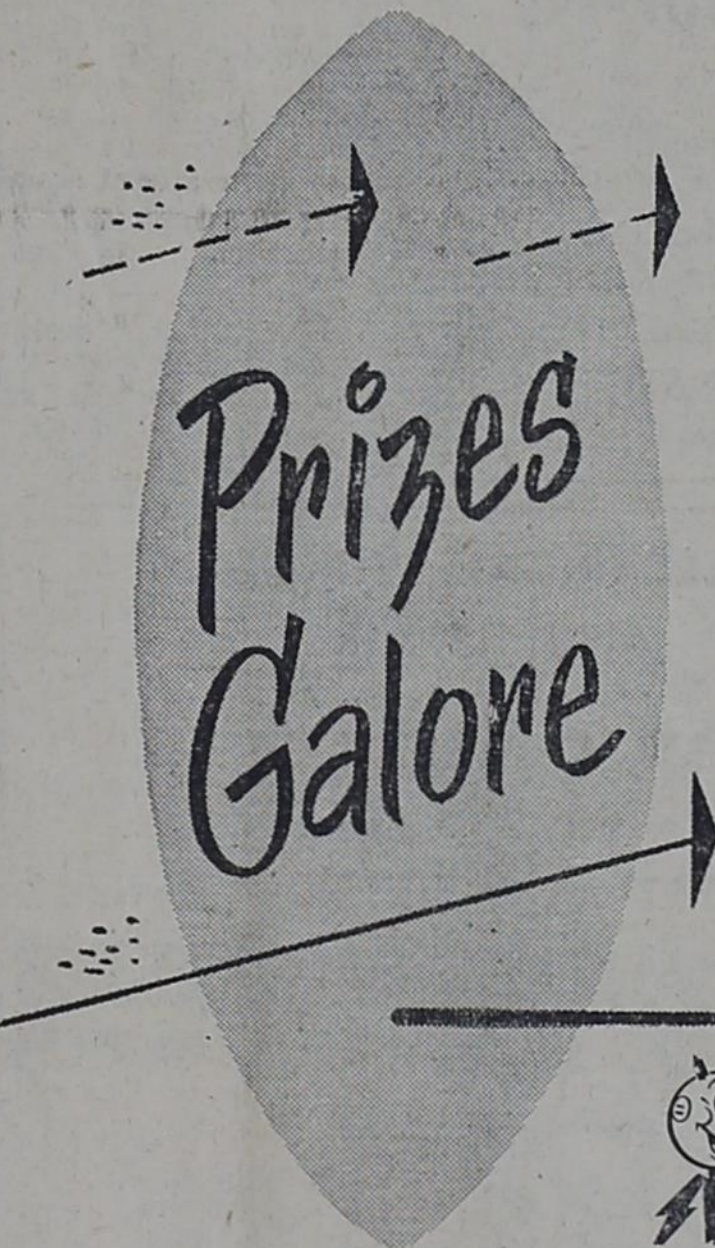
