Logan Retires After 50 Years

Dr. Joe B. Logan DDS (Doctor of Dental Surgery), and longtime Crockett County resident, has decided that 50 years is long enough and has retired his practice and has donated his equipment and supplies worth \$40-\$50,000 to the Champion Tooth Club of El Paso.

Dr. Logan was born in Sonora on July 14, 1916 where he attended school. He enlisted in the Navy after he graduated from Baylor University School of Dentistry in March of 1944,

and was stationed at Farrgut, Idaho. From Farrgut he attended the U.S. Naval Dental School at Bethesda, Maryland. After completing the school Dr. Logan sailed for Japan from Treasure Island in September of 1945 for a four month tour of duty before returning to Seattle on December 31, 1945. He was discharged from the Navy in May 1946 at San Diego.

Dr. Logan opened an office in Sonora with Dr. Tom White where he practiced for 10 years before moving to Ozona in September of 1946.

Dr. Logan's father, Joe F. Logan, lived south of Ozona on the Moss Ranch (later the Marge McMullan Ranch) before the country was organized in 1891. His father pumped water with a steam engine for the Moss cattle. He did this for 12 to 18 months and then moved to Kimble County.

Joe B. and Mary Logan have two children, Richard Ben and Sharon Leigh. Both children graduated from Ozona High School and now reside in Austin.

The Logans have both been involved in community and church activities over the years.

Dr. Logan served as president of the Ozona Chamber of Commerce, Ozona Lions Club, steward of the Ozona United Methodist Church and was a member of the Ozona Masonic Lodge. Mary K. served at one time as Worthy Mason of the Ozona Eastern Star.

Joe B. has served as past president of the San Angelo District Dental Society, and the West Texas District Dental Association. He was a member of the American Dental Association and the Academy of General Dentistry.

A Tiny Christmas Town

The Christmas village you may have seen in the window on Main Street has an extensive history. The tradition was first started by a man named Ledderman and later handed down to his son, H. Lee Ledderman. The village is an accumulation of 47 years' work for Lee Ledderman, who first set up a display of this type in 1941, and continued to do so every year until 1988. Some of the houses have been in the possession of the late Ledderman since he was 6 years old. The picket fence was given to Ledderman 47 years ago by his father. Some parts of this village were used by Ledderman's father in a smaller display, around the immediate area of the tree before he started his own display.

Some parts of the village represent parts of Lee's life. The bride and groom actually depict Lee and his wife and another scene shows Father Time and the Baby New Year together, which was how Ledderman and his wife dressed for a New Year's party one year. The older houses show the architectural style of decades ago, complete with stained glass windows. There are many parts to this tiny town: hills, roads, telephone poles, houses, churches, automobiles, and even tiny people.

The first display was in Dallas, and Lee has carried on the tradition each year while moving from there to San Angelo to Hobbs, N.M. and then to Houston in 1957.

Mr. Ledderman loved to have people come by and look

at the village and even had a guest book for people to sign. He once said, "I just sort of feel that people have taken Christmas outside the home too much, and I'd like to see more

people concentrate on the inside." His display was always plainly visible from the outside of his picture window, and everyone was welcome to come and look.

Lee Ledderman recently passed away, but his memory and the tradition is being carried on by his daughter, Pam Richardson of San Angelo, and her best friend of 26 years, Rhonda Lee of Sonora. They have added new things to the village through the years. Much of the original village is still displayed, however, some was left out due to lack of space. In future years, they hope to display different pieces, and eventually every part of the village if space allows.

"Pam and I hope to display the village until we are no longer able to, and are hoping that my children will carry on the tradition. Pam has no children, but she is Godmother to mine," stated Rhonda.

Kelly's Column



Although holidays are special times--they present unique challenges especially for those with special food needs. It is a time when many people may gain unwanted weight thus compromising their health. It may take a holiday meal make-over to enjoy the holidays with no weight gain. Overweight predisposes people to the development of heart disease, diabetes, etc. So keeping your weight within normal limits is important to help prevent these diseases.

If you are hosting a healthy meal, some basic changes you can offer your guests are a variety of lower-fat, lower-calorie foods along with traditional favorites. Modify recipes using some of the many low-fat choices offered by many of the food processors in response to consumer's concerns about health. For example, dairy products include many low or nonfat choices such as low or non-fat sour cream, skim milk and lower fat cheeses. Use more oils to replace hydrogenated or solid fats. Baste meats with wine, fruit juice, or broth instead of with butter or margarine. Use non-stick spray instead of butter, margarine or shortening on the pan when baking. Two egg whites can be substituted for a whole egg in most recipes to reduce cholesterol content. Replace buttered bread crumbs on tops of casseroles with crushed cereal. You not only reduce the fat, but you also increase complex carbohydrates -- a recommendation of the dietary guidelines. Another excellent complex carbohydrate source

is special request, lower fat or air popped popcorn. Use a variety of flavored salts to add flavor and interest to this high fiber snack.

Meat processors are offering a variety of lower fat alternatives for holiday fare. Low-fat varieties of cocktail sausages, lower fat beef or turkey sausages, and lower fat cold cuts. Serve these processed meats on top of a variety of whole wheat, rye, pumpernickel, or other breads with mustard, horseradish or low-fat mayonnaise or salad dressing that will add nutrition and flavor with less fat. Also add some vegetable dippers such as green peppers, broccoli, cherry tomatoes, radish roses, celery and carrot sticks with low-fat dips to add flavor, nutrition and interest to holiday snacks. Fruit such as apples, pears or grapes served with a special dip made with light cream cheese flavored with brown sugar and vanilla also adds interest and flavor to any holiday meal. Cutting portions for each food group is also important. Select leaner cuts from the (leg/loin) meat group to two 3-ounce portions which is about the size of a deck of cards. A skinless chicken breast is about three ounces also. Choose two or more servings of milk from low-fat choices. One half cup cooked or one cup of raw vegetables is a serving. Try to eat at least three servings of vegetables and two servings of fruit daily.

Introduce new lower fat holiday recipes and start some new family traditions. These are just a few ideas to start you off with your holiday meal make-over.

Social Security News

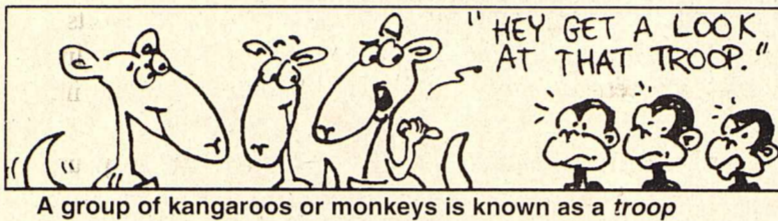
"Social Security beneficiaries will receive statements in the mail in January showing the benefits they received in 1993," said Franklin H. Upp, Social Security manager in San Angelo, Texas. This statement should be used to determine if any benefits are subject to Federal income tax. "To ensure you receive the statement," Upp said, "make sure Social Security has your correct address. This is especially important for individuals who receive their benefits by direct deposit."

Most of those who receive the statement, Form SSA-1099, will not have to pay taxes on their Social Security benefits because their total income is less than the taxable ceiling. "If you receive Social Security benefits as your only source of income, you are unlikely to owe Federal taxes on the benefits," Upp said.

An Internal Revenue Services (IRS) worksheet, IRS Notice 703, comes with the benefit statement. "The worksheet shows you how to

determine if your Social Security benefits are subject to tax," Upp explained. "If, after completing the worksheet, you have questions about your tax liability, you should call the IRS toll-free number, 1-800-829-1040, and ask for Publication 915, which contains tax information about Social Security benefits.

Beneficiaries who file an individual tax return may owe taxes on some of their benefits if their combined income exceeds \$25,000. Married couples who file joint tax returns may have to pay taxes on some of their benefits if their combined income exceeds \$32,000. Married couples who live together but file separate tax returns probably will pay taxes on part of their benefits. "For income tax purposes, Upp said, "combined income is defined as the sum of an individual's (or couple's) adjusted gross income plus interest plus one-half of all Social Security benefits received for the year."

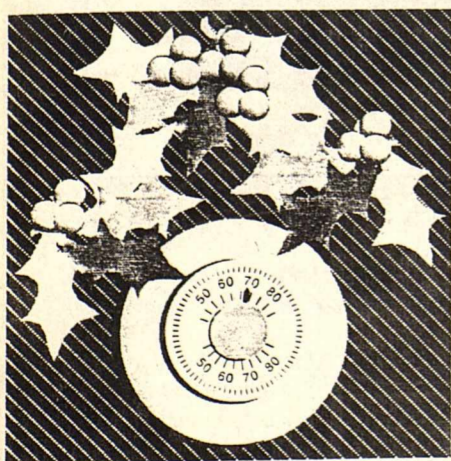

New Law To Go Into Effect

A new law that goes into effect January 1, 1994 will eliminate the need for commercial vehicle operations to have their commercial vehicles undergo dual inspections. The new inspection program, to be overseen by the Texas Department of Public Safety, will combine the U.S. Department of Transportation inspection with the State of Texas safety inspection.

Beginning January 1, inspections obtained at other than an official commercial Texas State Inspection Station will not be accepted.

Commercial motor vehicle means any self-propelled or towed vehicle except a farm vehicle with a gross weight, registered weight or gross weight rating of less than 48,000 pounds used on a public highway to transport passengers or property when: the vehicle or combination of vehicle has a gross weight, registered or gross weight rating in excess of 26,000 pounds; or the vehicle is designed to transport more than 15 people including the driver; or the vehicle is used to transport an amount of hazardous materials requiring placarding under the federal Hazardous Materials Transportation Act.

Ask The Historical Society

by The Sutton County Historical Society

Q. Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25th and why do we have Christmas trees?

A. According to the "New Standard Encyclopedia" Christians began to celebrate Christmas about 200. But they observed it on varying dates, because the exact date of Christ's birth was unknown. In 354, December 25 was declared by Pope Julius to be the birthday of Christ, and in 440 Pope Sixtus of Rome decreed that Christmas should be celebrated on that date.

The Christmas Tree

The following stories are taken from the "New Standard Encyclopedia," "Parents' Magazine's Christmas Holiday Book" and several legends on Christmas cards that have been collected through the years:

Christmas Tree, a tree used in celebrating Christmas. It is generally an evergreen, and is decorated and lighted. In some parts of Hawaii real flowers are used to decorate the trees. New Zealanders use as a Christmas tree a pohutukawa, which has red flowers and silvery leaves in the winter and is often misshapen, like a Japanese bonsai. In Wilmington, North Carolina, an ancient oak provides a permanent Christmas tree, trimmed with 7,000 colored lights and several tons of Spanish moss.

Legends of the Christmas tree:

In the Middle Ages, the German peoples celebrated the feast of Adam and Eve, and at the center of the ritual was a dramatization of the story of the Garden of Eden. One of the props used for this was a fir tree decked with apples to represent the Fall. On the following day, Christmas, it was the custom to burn pyramid shaped candelabra called "Lightstocks." Over the years these candles came to be added to the fir tree along with round cookies, shaped like the Host, as symbols of the Redemption. Thus the Christmas tree was born.

One legend is that the Protestant reformer Martin Luther was the inventor of the Christmas Tree. One Christmas Eve, so goes the story, Luther was walking beneath a night sky filled with stars, while the moon lit up the surrounding snow clad firs. Moved by the scene, he hurried home and set up a sapling in his house, laden with candles to simulate the stars. And so the Christmas tree was born--several hundred years after it had already become popular. But no one can begrudge such a charming legend a little latitude in chronology.

Long before Luther, many parts of Germany, headed by Saxony, celebrated Christmas with a tree substitute, a pyramid made of wood and decorated with candles and fruit. In some cases these "trees" were carried from house to house with requests for money, a practice later to be adopted by carol singers.

There is a legend that comes down to us from the early days of Christianity in England. One of those helping to spread Christianity among the Druids was a monk named Wilfred (later Saint Wilfred). One day, surrounded by a group of his converts, he struck down a huge Oak tree, which, in the Druid religion was an object of worship. As the Oak tree fell to the earth, it split into four pieces, and from its center there grew a young Fir tree, pointing a green spire toward the sky. The crowd gazed in amazement.

Wilfred let his axe drop, and turned to speak. "This little tree shall be your Holy Tree tonight. It is the wood of peace, for your houses are built of Fir. It is the sign of an endless life, for its leaves are evergreen. See how it points towards the heavens.

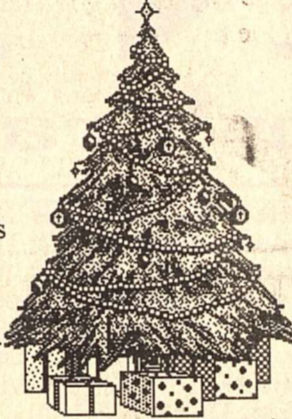
Let this be called the tree of the Christ Child. Gather about it, not in the wilderness, but in your homes. There it will be surrounded with loving gifts and rites of kindness." And to this day, that is why the Fir Tree is one of our loveliest symbols of Christmas.

One legend says that the custom of the Christmas tree was started by Saint Boniface (680-755), while he was a missionary to Germany. One Christmas Eve he told converts that the fir tree pointed upward to the Christ Child, and urged them to take the tree into their homes as a sign of their new worship as Christians. Having a public Christmas tree in Sonora is not a new custom, it dates back to the 1890's when citizens of the town placed a tree in the old wooden school house and made sure that no child in Sonora went without a present. Usually after the gift giving a grand ball was held, at first in the school house and later in the courthouse.

There are many other legends around Christmas regarding, poinsettias, yule logs, mistletoe, ivy, holly and different Christmas punches and baked goods. There are stories from different lands of Santa Claus, Kris Kringle, The Christmas Angel, Italy's Old Woman and Dutch children's wooden shoes. In future years we will cover some of these.
