sino discarded the deuce of clubs. Next came the queen of diamonds, aken by East with the king. East then ashed the queen of spades, on which ansino discarded his ace of clubs! East thereupon cashed the king of
clubs and continued with a club, promoting a trump trick for West whether declarer rutfed high or low, and as ane.

It was all very fancy, but it was al very logical too. Cansino could tell from south's bidaing, as well as th pray, that declarer had sarted
precisely a $5-6-1-1$ distribution. Cansino also realized that the contract could not be stopped unless the
defense could somehow score defense could somehow score
trump trick. Without it, there was no hope. He therefore had to assume that East had the jack or ten of trumps, as well as the king of clubs,

the only way to defeat the contract. Miracuiously, everything worked out exactly as Cansino had planned It just goes to show that if you think
