**Shatter-Proof Glass Gets Elastic Quality**

LEIPZIG, (U.P.)—A new plastic form of glass has been developed which is not only shatter-proof but actively elastic.

The glass is made of a synthetic resinous substance, is light, transparent and cannot be distinguished from real glass. Under pressure a pane of this glass will bulge but return to its original form. One of the first practical applications of the new elastic glass has been in the windows of the airship Hindenburg.

The new elastic glass, which will be demonstrated at the Leipzig Fair, may upset the old adage about throwing stones.
