DRILLING RESUMED IN COCHRAN TEST

Bond & Harrison Wildcat Starts Up After Shut-Down

Drilling was resumed this morning in Bond & Harrison et al No. 1 Cameron eastern Cocran wildcat, after a shut-down of two weeks while titles were cleared.
