YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio, June 25 (AP)— Dynamite blasts boomed as the back-to-work movement in the steel strike locked mills of the Mahoning Valley got underway today after Governor Martin L. Davey of Ohio announced the plants could resume operations under national guard protection.

The president's mediation board planned to leave Cleveland after an unsuccessful attempt to settle the strike with an appeal for a "man to man" conference with steel corporation and unionist officials. Miners peacefully picketed Beth-

lehem Steel's Cambria workers here but a projected march of 30,000 miners on the city apparently failed to materialize.



### **HEAT WAVE OVER COUNTRY CAUSES** THIRTEEN TO DIE

Six Deaths Occur In Chicago When 97 Is Registered

CHICAGO, June 25 (AP)—A heat wave spread from the plains of Texas to the Great Lakes today, accounting for at least thirteen deaths and establishing new record June temperatures at many points.

Six of the deaths were in Chicago, where thermometers elimbed to 97 degrees. In ten hours the temperature ascended 27 degrees to set a new June 24 record. The old record, 93, was established in 1923. Shenandoah, Iowa, sweltered under a record high of 107. Des Moines

Major rehousing projects undertaken by the federal government are at last nearing completion in Cleveland, homes and duplexes for rental purand the rent scales have been announced. In the cheaper poses of the two projects, rents begin at \$12.75 a month for tworoom apartments, and go up to \$22.44 a month for six rooms. In addition, charges for heat, water and electricity will be collected with the rent. These charges will range from about \$5.35 to \$8 a month.

As ordinary rents go, those scales are moderate enough; but they are not moderate for the typical slum ment, in writing to E. T. Marion, dweller. 

modern tanks, nevertheless, was sufficiently strong to resist the warfare of the time. Also, a collection of ammunition, including arrowheads, stones and pieces of iron, was found inside the tank.

Other discoveries were made by Matherat in the course of his excavations and the most important are the ruins of the Roman bridge which was built by Labienus, one of Julius Caesar's lieutenants, about 51 B. C. This bridge was built entirely of wood and it is in a good state of preservation, having been covered by 10 feet of soil fol-lowing an earthquake in the 5th

For many years, Matherat had been aware of the existence of this bridge, buried somewhere near Beauvais, and only after careful research was he able to disclose it. A horseshoe, pieces of Roman armor and many projectiles also were among the discoveries made in this same region by the ex-

supply. Adequate water is available at the Cloverdale wells, but the daily consumption thus far in the summer is taxing the capacity of present mains to lift water to the 100 foot tower as fast as it is being used.

Although the daily consumption on hot days is running 1,250,000 gallons, when the new reservoir and pumps are put in service in about a week the supply each day will be 2,500,000 gallons, or twice the amount now being used.
