Behind the Scenes in Washington

Less than three years ago the administration fashioned a nose for its opponents and rebels. Now the same administration has found its own neck in that noose.

Away back in Republican days the air rang intermittently with Democratic howls in the White House about the "gag rules", which were effectively administered by the triumvirate of Speaker Longworth, Majority Leader Tilson and Rules Committee Chairman Shell.

The old Republican rules used to say that the House couldn't even instruct a committee to let loose of a bill except by a majority vote of the committee. Usually a committee chairman usually could "pocket veto" legislation if he liked, and that practically no "unsatisfactory" measure ever got by Shell.

Then the Democrats, who had been screaming so loudly, found themselves with a majority in 1931 and promptly liberalized the discharge rule, requiring only 145 signatures to a petition to force a vote.

In the next Congress Democrats were completely in control and under the 145-names rule insurgents began to get petitions on "cash bonus" and other bills embarrassing the administration. So what did they do? They got a majority but ran through a new rule requiring a majority — 218 signatures — to discharge a bill from committee and onto the floor!

Ghostly Mine Towns Come to Life With Renewal of Hydraulic Process

NEYADA CITY, Cal. (UP)—Mining men foresee far-reaching activity great benefits to come. They said natural erosion from the Sierra, now carried down the Sacramento river, will be stopped by the debris dams, and the Federal government will save thousands of dollars spent to keep the river open to navigation.

The Sacramento, a major inland waterway, is used extensively by San Francisco Bay region and up-country California shipping.

Meantime, at Relief Hill, the sight of outlet tunnels, sluiceways and ditches, familiar to old-time miners, is reassuring the residents of that vicinity. Maximum operation is expected by 1938.

One mining man, elated by prospects of renewed operations, said: "We of the old school of hydraulic mining will install every new method for the recovery of not only the fine free gold but the black sands which also contain fine gold, platinum and other precious minerals, the great part of which was lost by the old methods of hydraulic mining."

FHLB Keeps Million Homes in Repairs

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25.—To help solve the vast problem of keeping 1,000,000 homes on which it holds mortgages—in good repair the Home Owners' Loan Corporation made public today a revised list of Master Specifications of construction in the home industry to follow. The list is in the form of a conveniently sized booklet, is for the use of contractors and is intended to insure the best standards of materials and workmanship.

Although no existing standards were comprehensive enough to serve as a guide in preparing the Master Specifications, the HOLC had behind it the experience of reconditioning 447,000 homes at a total cost of \$33,500,000. This work, carried out through the organization of a Reconditioning Division which consequently had contacts with thousands of contractors in all parts of the country.

It is safe to say that no other single organization has dealt with such a wide variety of contractors as has the Reconditioning Division during the past three years.

"They are looking for six houses during the past three years," it was stated in the announcement. "Consequently, it is particularly well equipped to take the first step towards the coordination of the construction industry and work out the necessary of standardization."

 If a spicy taste is preferred, omit the vinegar. Ham should be boiled in water in tepid water. Cold water tends to harden the tissues. If the meat is to be served cold, allowing it to cool in the water in which it is cooked preserves its juiciness.

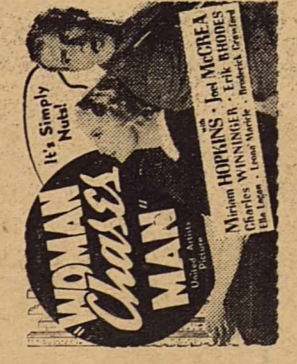

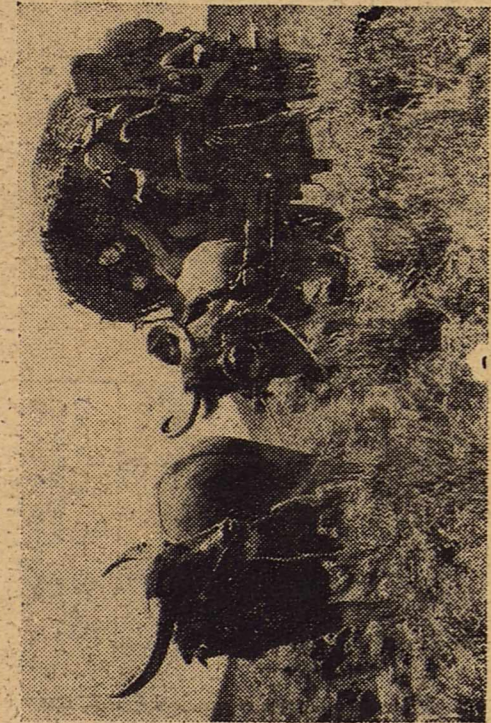
