## Tips Are Given For Holding One's Mail

"If work or vacation should ever take you away from home, the Postal Service would like to remind you that there are several options available when determining what to do with your mail," says Bovina Postmaster Laura Bartlett.

"If you'll be away just a few days and don't have time to notify the Post Office, ask a friend or neighbor to pick up any mail from your box," Mrs. Bartlett says. "Accumulated mail in a box is an advertisement that the house is vacant."

"Small receptacles such as apartment house boxes have a limited capacity. Your carrier will remove accumulated mail when the box becomes full, and leave a notice to pick up the mail at the Post Office."

"We will be glad to hold your mail at the Post Office for up to 30 days," says Postmaster Bartlett.

"Either stop by the office here, or ask your carrier for a hold mail card. Be sure to specify the dates which you would like your mail held, fill out the card, sign it and hand it to a clerk or your carrier a day or two before you leave."

"The Postal Service does not accept requests to hold mail for one day or requests made by telephone," Mrs. Bartlett says.

"When you return, you can

either pick up the accumulated mail at the office, or call and ask that it be delivered the next day. Since there may be more mail than will fit in the box, someone should be available to receive it.

"If you expect to be away for more than 30 days, you should consider a temporary address change," says the Postmaster. "Simply pick up a change of address order from the Post Office or your carrier and fill it out completely, including the effective date and the date you wish to terminate the order."

"We want to work with you to ensure uninterrupted mail service," Mrs. Bartlett concluded.

## Pet Clinic Is Slated

The annual rabies vaccination clinic for dogs will be held Saturday, April 29, beginning at 10 a.m. at the Bovina Fire Station.

Dr. Dale Schueler will be giving the shots and cost of the rabies vaccination and city tags is \$7.00 per animal.

City ordinance requires that all dogs kept within the city limits receive a rabies vaccination yearly, and also have their tags.

## Junior High Girls Are Track Champs

The Bovina Junior High girls track team used heroic efforts from all fifteen members as they won the district championship title Saturday at Sudan.

"This is the first time Bovina girls have won a district track title in quite some time, and this turned out to be an exciting title chase," said Coach Kathy Rundell.

The championship came down to the last race of the day and Bovina used a come-from-behind finish and won the race, as well as the team title with a total of 154-1/5 points. Rival, Springlake-Earth finished second in the race and second overall with 152-1/2 points.

"A meet like this makes you realize just how important each point is. For instance, a fifth place finish, worth two points, separated Springlake and us for first and second. I was so proud of the effort and team spirit each girl showed. It was unreal how hard each girl tried. They were just great!" Rundell continued.

The girls really produced some great results, and came away with 56-1/5 points after the field events. Sophia Espinoza won the high jump with a leap of 4-4 and set a new school record in the long jump as she won with a jump of 14-1¼.

"Our relays really came through for us, also. The girls used great finishes on all three relays as they each won, garnishing twenty points each," the coach added.

The 800 relay foursome of Kimberly Kirkpatrick, Nancy Vargas, Christina Noriega and Espinoza, set a new school record time of 2:00.17 as they won in almost a photo finish.

The sprint relay team of Espinoza, Vargas, Noriega and Saenz, also won in a time of 55.57.

The mile relay team of Kirkpatrick, Stephanie Rackley,

Espinoza and Lorena Saenz used splits of 73, 75, 66 and 64 seconds respectively to come away with the all-important last win.

The other first place finish for the Colts came from speedster Lorena Saenz as she blew the 200-meter field away in a time of 28.24.

## FFA Ruffling New Shotgun

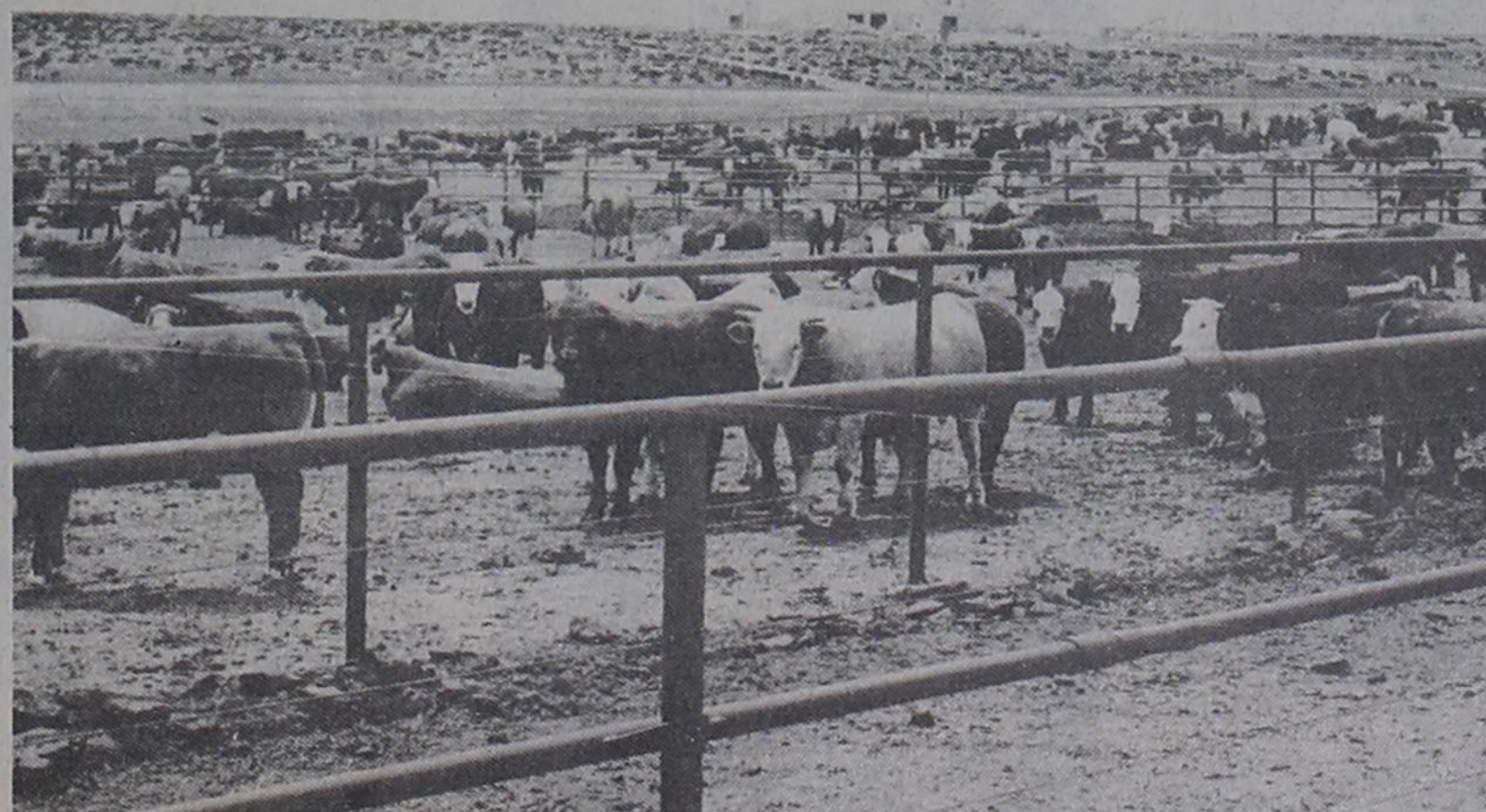
