

HEAVY BIG LAKE CLUB FAVORED TO DEFEAT BULLDOGS TONIGHT

CLUB RIDDLED WITH INJURIES; THREE REGULARS DEFINITELY OUT OF GAME

A badly crippled team of Midland Bulldogs tonight will make their second appearance of the season when the Big Lake Owls invade Lackey Field at 8 o'clock.

For the first time in more than a year the Bulldogs will be the underdogs.

The Midland team is worse battered than any that has been forced to take the field here in a long time, and to make matters worse, they are going up against a club that is expected to outweigh them from five to 15 pounds per man.

Three Midland regulars will be out of the starting line-up and it will be kept out by illness. Several is almost a foregone conclusion.

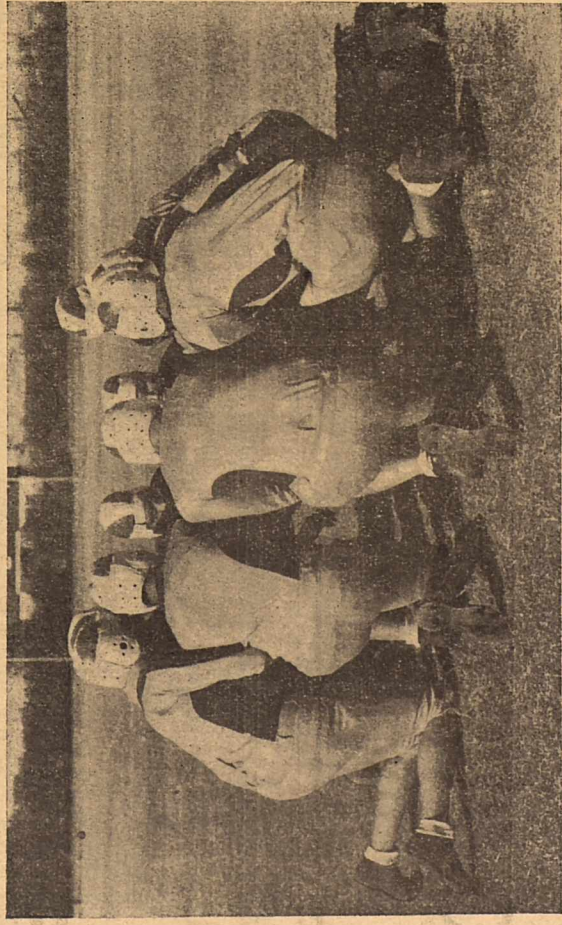

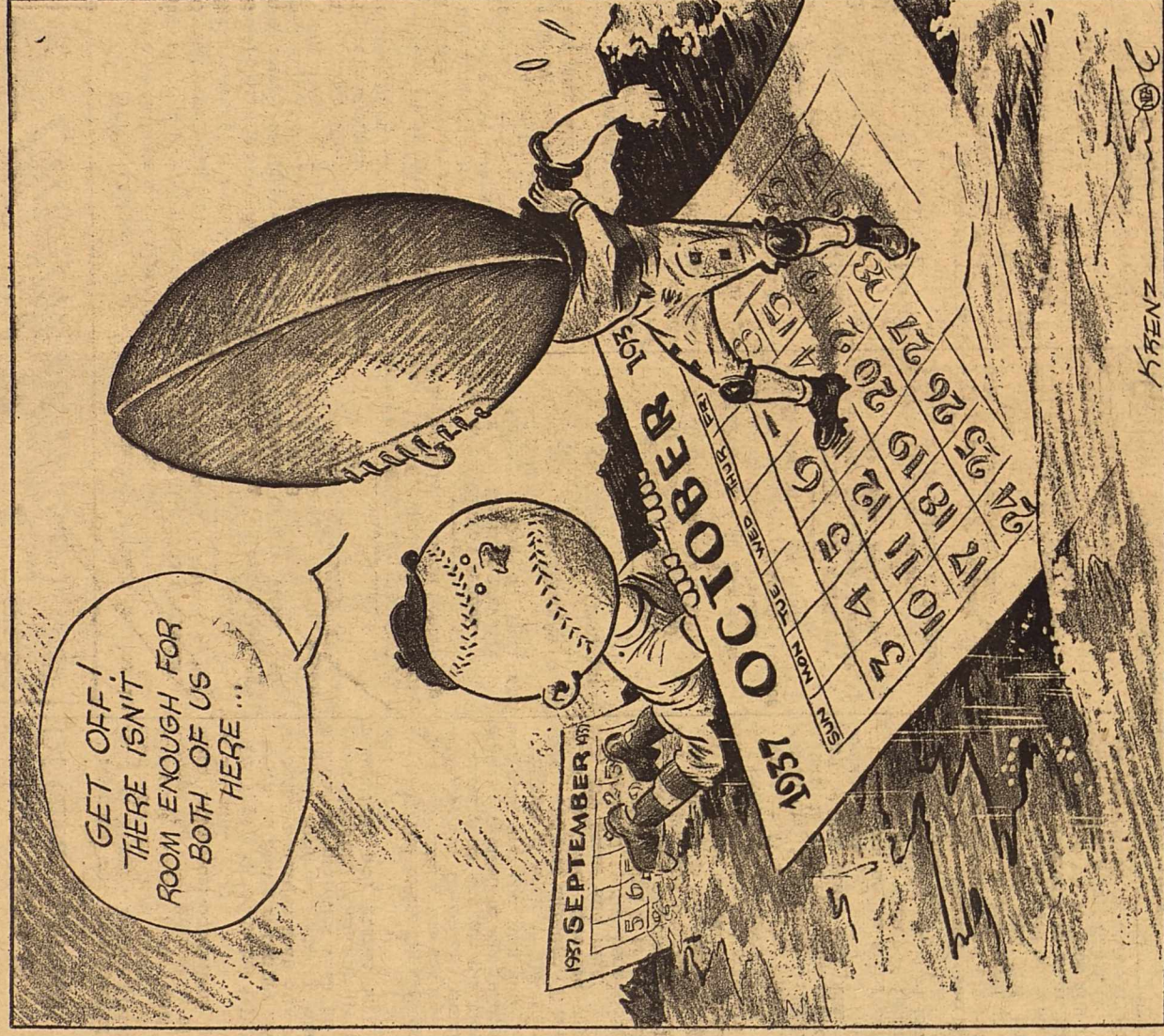

G. O. P. Rallies For Michigan Victory in '38

BAY CITY, Mich. (UP)—Michigan Republicans met here Sept. 17 and 18 and launched their 1938 campaign against the administration of Gov. Frank Murphy.

Striving for party harmony, the Republicans will rally around many state leaders are confident will be the Republican Presidential candidate in 1940.

The Republican rally, 13 months before Michigan again elects state officers, will open the campaign at the earliest date in the state's recent history.

Plans are being made to reorganize and revitalize the Republican Party in Michigan. James F. Thomson, chairman of the state central committee, said. Besides the committee, 22 other Republican organizations grouped under the Michigan League of Republican Clubs, will participate in the rally.

Vandenbergh In Active Role

Vandenbergh has been conferring with state leaders since adjournment of Congress. They are convinced that, by emphasizing the leader nationally, he will serve as the man around whom at least five factions of the party in this state can rally next year.

The senator's speech the night of Sept. 18 to the rally has been broadcast over a nationwide hook-up indicating to many Michigan Democrats that Vandenbergh may be a national Republican ally.

The major issue of the 1938 Michigan campaign already has been set. It is the labor policy of Governor Murphy, mediator of the automotive strikes, who returned from the high commissionership of the Philippines to lead the Democrats to power in Michigan.

The radio-active elements will be used to study such processes as the flow of materials through plant and animal bodies.

Yan de Graff generator, 4,000,000 volts of electricity will be part of the laboratory. There are but three similar generators at the United States at present; at the Westinghouse laboratory in Pittsburgh; at the Carnegie Institute in Washington, D. C., and a small one at the University of Wisconsin.

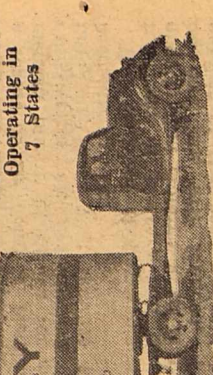
The machine will be used to make tracers and will produce radio-active substances. It will be 33 feet high, 18 feet in diameter.

With the high voltage generator it will be possible to bombard chemical elements with protons and neutrons of high energy. Under this bombardment, many elements are transmitted into radio-active modifications, and the resulting elements will be used in research.
