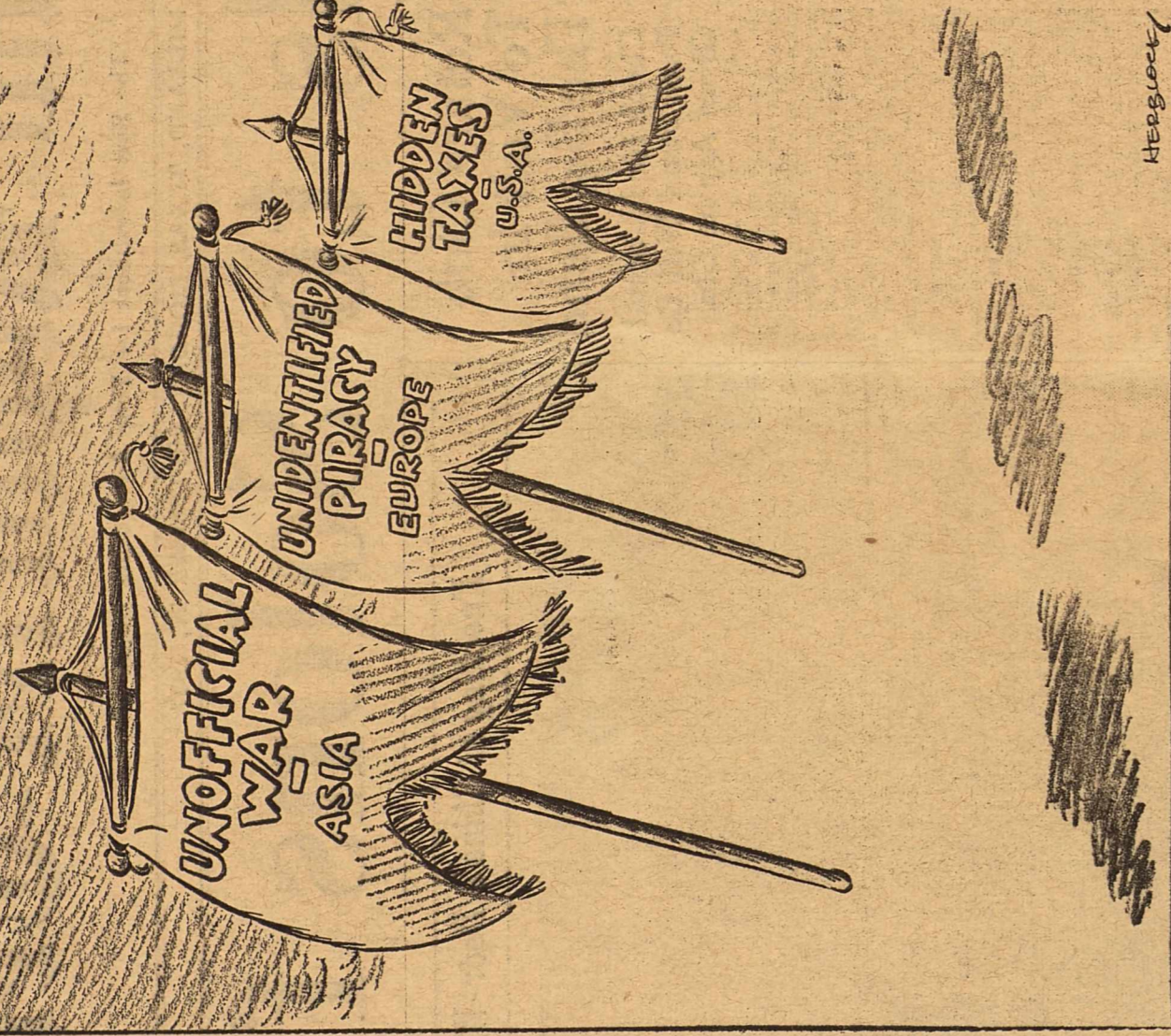

Britain's Navy Could Strangle Commerce Of Italy If War Came Between Countries

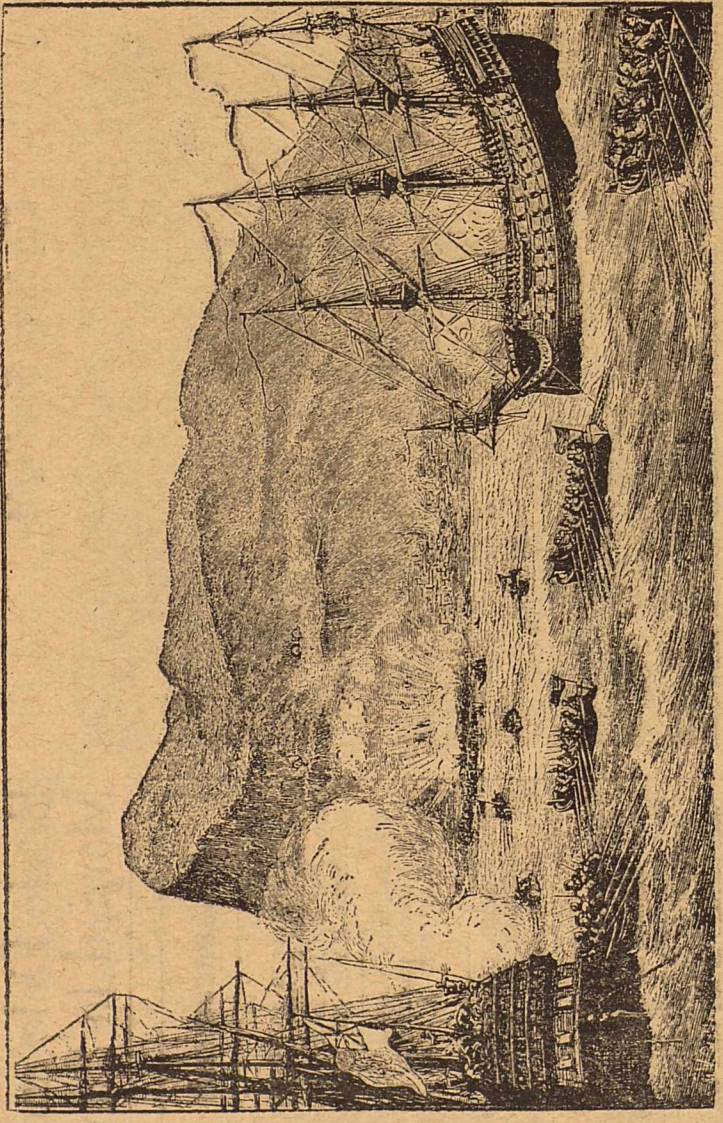
This is the third of four articles by Milton Bronner on the subject of the Mediterranean naval tension, which recently resulted in an international "anti-piracy" naval patrol.

LONDON: Sept. 27.—"I wish to Heaven our British naval attaches were here now."
The speaker was a British naval officer, who was watching the great coronation naval review held by King George VI last spring at Spithead. Before his eyes were some 30 miles of British warships other than the main battle line and other States could equal. The display was ostensibly put on for the benefit of the newly-crowned king; actually, it was intended as an object lesson for any ambitious European power.

For although Mussolini, by his actions in the Ethiopian and Spanish wars, showed himself willing to make Italy dominant in the Mediterranean, the inescapable fact remains that in such a war England would have all the odds in her favor.

Could Lock Doors on Italy.
In such a war, Italy could probably close the Mediterranean to British merchant shipping and make the transit of British supplies extremely difficult. In such a case, her tonnage could completely lock the doors on Italy.
By her possession of Gibraltar and the Suez canal, and her immensely superior fleet, she could completely paralyze Italian sea-borne commerce outside of the Mediterranean. Italy needs vast supplies of raw material—such things as coal, copper, iron, cotton, wool, oil, and other commodities which are not readily obtainable in her own land—and could shut off her supply with rubbers certainty.
Furthermore, to keep British ships out of the Mediterranean would not be a fatal blow. They could sail around Africa, by way of the Cape of Good Hope. British naval strategists are now collaborating with those of the Dominion of South Africa to prepare for just such a contingency.

South African ports will be made to take care of the large number of ships which would have to take the South Atlantic route to the Far East, and steps are being taken to perfect the defenses of Capetown and Durban against attack from the air or the sea.
Britain Reinforces Navy.
The rearmament program must be taken into account.
This vast, five-year plan calls for the spending of \$7,500,000,000, all but two billions of which are to be raised by direct taxation. Five Agw. battleships—giant giants of 35,000 tons, with 36-knot speed—are being built. So are three large aircraft carriers, and a number of fast cruisers, especially designed

those which might be destroyed in the Mediterranean. These ships are being replaced through the existing British shipbuilding industry, which is being reorganized and strengthened. It now consists of four battlecruisers, two battle cruisers, four heavy cruisers, five light cruisers, and two new anti-aircraft cruisers, and aircraft carrier. 33 destroyers, eight patrol vessels, and 49 of the latest submarine types are now in commission. Ships detailed to the "anti-piracy" A Huge Air Force.

By far the greatest item in England's immense rearmament program is being made in the air. The last annual appropriation for air-craft was \$400,000,000; next year it will be bigger. It is almost impossible to buy an airplane in England today. More than 65,000 men are working at top speed in British aircraft factories, turning out planes for the government. And all of this is to increase an air force which on April 1 of this year stood at 146 squadrons, with a personnel strength of 480 officers and 51,000 men.
No definite figures as to the ultimate size of the program have ever been given out, but from statements made by the Air Minister and the Minister for Coordination of Defense it has been deduced that order for more than 10,000 planes have been placed to cover the expansion period. As a result, heavy orders have been placed for the Fairey Battle and Bristol Blenheim medium bombers, and for the heavy bomber of Handley Page Harrow, Armstrong Whitworth Whitley and Vickers Wellington.
The fastest of these is the Bristol Blenheim, which has a cruising speed of 379 miles an hour at a maximum of 44,000 feet, and which is said to have done better in practice flights, than the 300 miles an hour top speed of the Italian "crack" bombing planes.
For Accurate Aim.
Some of us recently were invited to witness exhibition flights near Capetown. We saw one of the most accurate with control in the world. It was a "crack" plane, which was able to look like a mere crawl—a feat which would enable it to take very accurate aim at the chosen target.
We saw also a new Hawker "Blenheim" equipped with control start-up, which was able to leave the ground in precisely four and one-half seconds (by a stop watch) and it had begun to move, and which sent it up to an altitude of several thousand feet inside of a few minutes.
From what has just been written, it can be seen that Britain is intensely keen about her rearmament. The plain truth is that the British had been lulled into a false feeling of security. Like America, Britain really believed that the world war had ended the danger of big wars in the future. American, and a number of other nations, including the United States, it wanted to forget about military affairs and go ahead with the business of making a living.
Lion Still Has Claws.
The rise of Hitler in Germany, Mussolini's open plan to secure domination of the Mediterranean and the disarmament of the United States, the Spanish war—all of these jarred Englishmen out of their complacency.
They felt that the British lion had become too fond of purring softly, and so, when Field Marshal Sir Philip Chetwode, recently adjutant-general in the British Expeditionary Force, was giving a lecture in London, he made this remark:
"The British lion still has a few claws left, and he has recently been to the dentist to have his teeth sharpened."
And he followed it with this blunt warning:

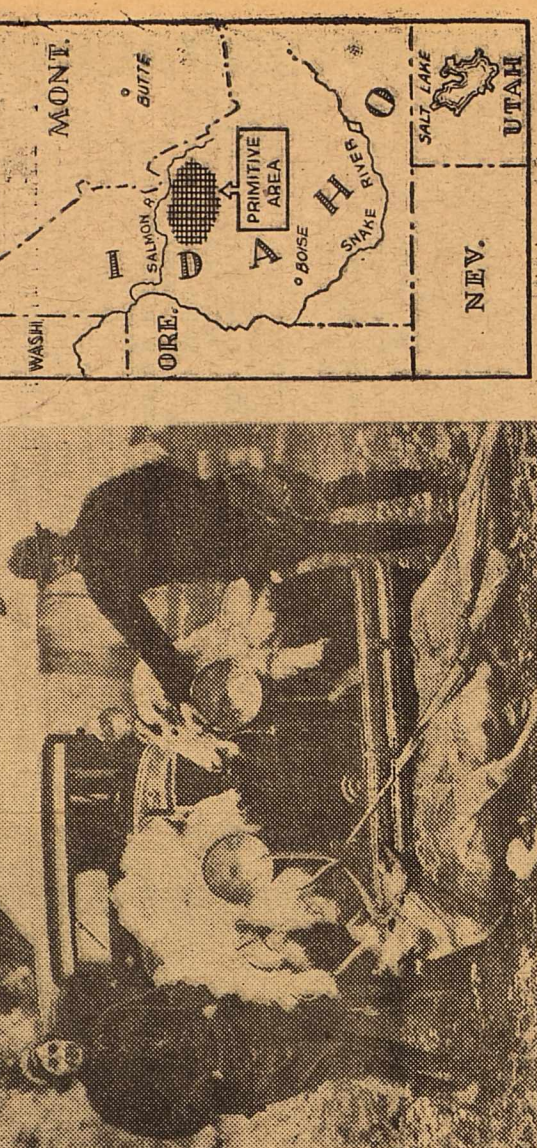

BOISE, Idaho, Sept. 27.—An area of 22,000 acres, bought by the Idaho National Forest, is the day when the Red Men were its only inhabitants, is the Idaho "primitive area," set aside for recreational purposes in the heart of the "River of No Return" country, the Salmon river of Idaho.
The sportsman has been guaranteed that the area will be the most scenic, game and fish country in the world. It is permitted there, and the government has decreed that there will be no roads built into it for any purpose.
The section actually is just what hunters and fishermen have dreamed about for generations. It is a vast area of water, with state and federal government, and numerous streams that also abound in fish. All varieties of wild game are there, including mountain goat and sheep, deer, elk, bear, and in the Big Horn creag country moose.

Scarcity of Dwellings.
THERE are few ranches inside the boundary of the primitive area, partly a section of the Idaho National Forest and partly in Salmon National Forest. What few there are have been set up as lodges at landing fields for the forest service. A few major fire trails are provided for protection of the vast region.

A fisherman or hunter planning a visit to this section must be a hardy soul, for the only way to get into the interior is by air or pack trail.
The area is within 50 miles of Sun Valley, and the only road has been built to the boundary points. Once the boundary is reached, however, the sportsman is on his own.
Going in by air is rather hazardous, yet it saves days of weary travel by pack trail. There are mountains to be crossed, and canyons to be crossed, and many of the landing strips are through narrow canyons.

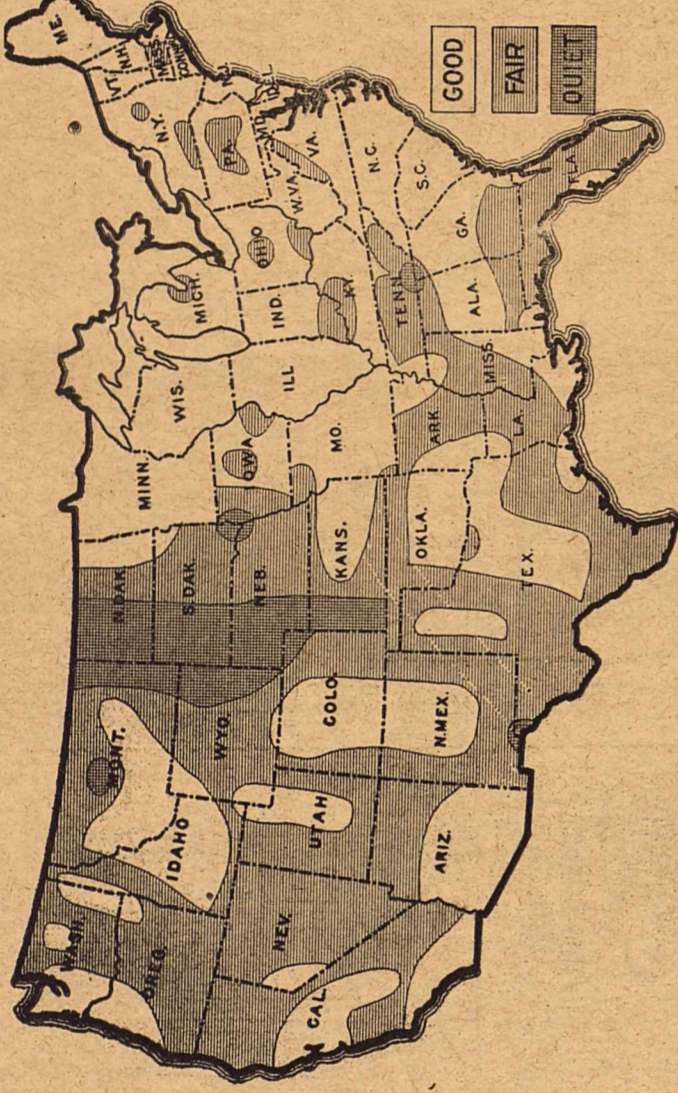

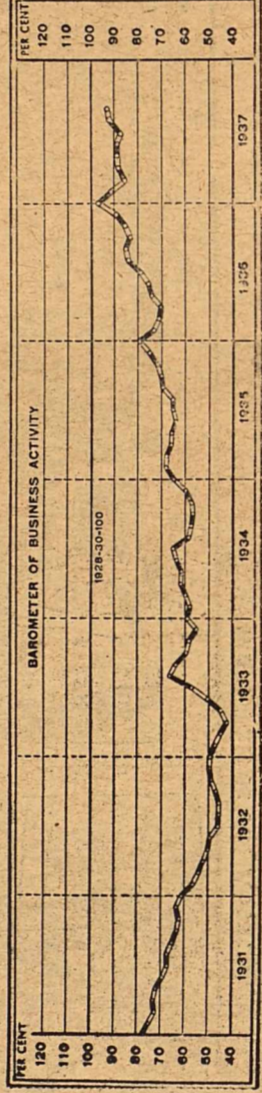

Business Conditions

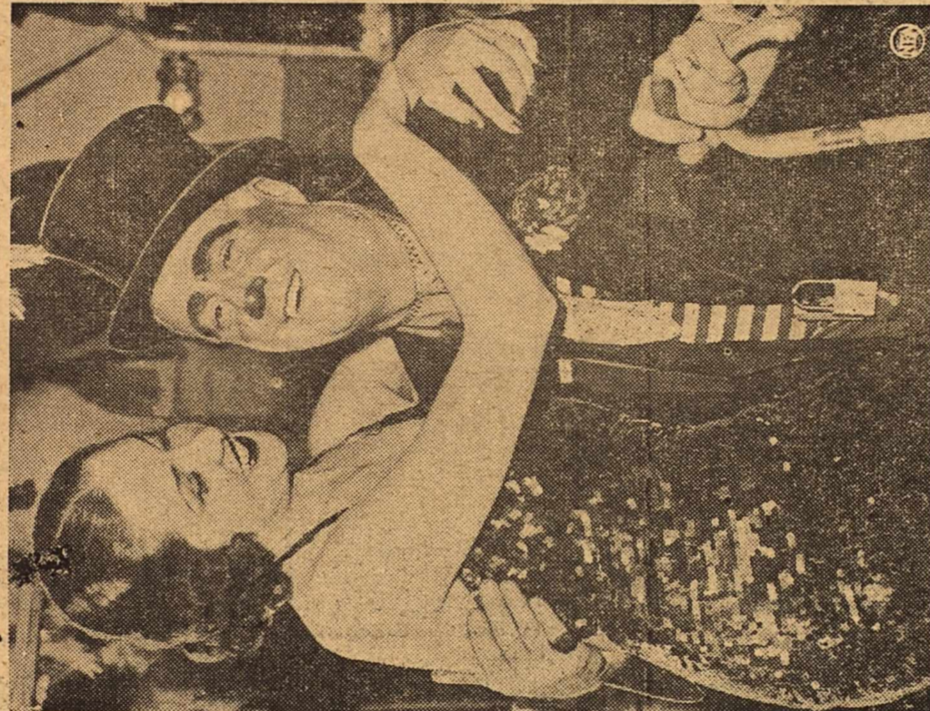


This map represents business conditions as of September 1, 1937, as shown in "Nation's Business", official publication of the United States Chamber of Commerce.

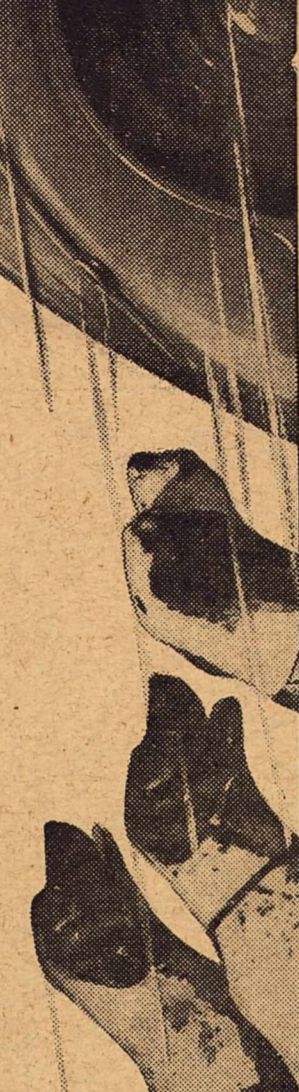

Shooting Code of G-Men Calls For Quick Fire At the Stomach To Shatter Aim of Gunman Foe

BY MILES W. VAUGHN.
WASHINGTON (UP)—I was in the custody of G-men for more than two hours in a thrilling experience that lasted from the time a special agent sent more than 25 shots spattering from his 'tommy' gun with deadly aim until they rolled my tense fingers across a pad to record my prints.

Fortunately, it was not punitive custody. I became one of the legion of Washington visitors who make the operation. It usually takes only 12 minutes for the crime laboratory points of identification to obtain a report established by J. Edgar Hoover's favorable jury reaction. Must Be Crack Shots.

Although less than 5 per cent of the investigative duty of Federal agents involved armed conflict with desperadoes, their ability with weapons is tested daily.
