



# MacArthur Advisers Carry Ambitions To Decide Nip Policy

WASHINGTON — (P) — Nursing ambitions at policy making rather than mere advice giving, the Allied Far Eastern Commission leaves Wednesday for Japan and a look-see at Gen. Douglas MacArthur's administration.

Weather permitting, commission members will board a plane here at 6:15 p.m. (CST). After flying to Pearl Harbor, they will complete the trip on the U.S.S. Mt. Mc-Kinley, a Navy command ship. They expect to return to

Washington about February 15.

What the commissioners will do is study carefully how United States directives to MacArthur have been carried out.

Up to now, the commission has devoted most of its time to debating the directives themselves. A basic policy committee under lead-ership of Australia's foreign minister, Herbert V. Evatt, has rewritten the original White House directive to MacArthur, issued shortly after the Japanese surrender.

Document Forwarded

This document now has been forwarded to the 10 governments for consideration. If approved, it will be forwarded to MacArthur. U. S. officials say this government would have no objection, because the rewrite seeks only to "tighten up" and clarify the instructions.

Some members, however, believe the time is approaching when the commission should take over the actual power to formulate policy for Japan; that once the strictly military phase of the occupation is over, the commission should move to Japan and issue its own instruc-tions directly to MacArthur.

#### Unlikable Men

People seem increasingly fond of quoting the late Will Rogers' remark that "I never met a man I didn't In fact, there are alarming symptoms that the bounty of perceptive quips that Will bequeathed the public is being forgotten, and that he will finally be remembered only for a statement which, to say the least, was ill-considered.

It may be that Will, though a man of sharp, satirical mind and broad travel, really meant what he said. If so, he must have had an excess of saintliness or an extravagant want of taste. But the more interesting point is not that Will Rogers made the remark but that, of all his observations, this seems to be the one that the public has singled out to admire most and to repeat oftenest

Certainly, few, if any, of those who admire and repeat the Rogers confessions can honestly claim that they, too, never met a man they didn't like. So the remark must endure not as a compliment to mankind, but as an example of an indiscriminate but ideal friendliness which is considered worth emulating.

What brought all this to our mind was the succession of shocking events that culminated, happily, in the execution of Josef Kromer and his 10 fellow-sadists of the Belsen concentration camp, and the conviction of Yamashita in

If Will Rogers had lived to learn about Kramer and Yamashita, and the thousands who did their bidding, and the higher-ups who gave them their orders or condoned their deeds, he probably would have withdrawn his fa- Moscow. mous remark. For they are men whom no decent human being could like.

It may be understandable that back in the Golden Age of Peace and Prosperity there were many people Soviet forces actually would withearnestly striving to live and think in such a way that they too could say, "I never met a man I didn't like." Mankind seemed decent enough then to permit a kindly person to search himself for faults whenever he felt a twinge of dislike toward one of his fellow men.

But such charitable good fellowship had its dangers. We came to where we just couldn't believe that the Hitler gang was as black as it was painted. We couldn't comorehend the inhuman cruelty of thousands of our fellow humans in Japan and Germany, though the evidence piled lowing the stabbing of City Policeup through the years, until we were confronted with Lobb's home here. irrefutable proof.

So we Americans had to learn. And now we know. At least we should know that there still exist in the world dent. men whom God Himself could not like. We, and the organization of nations formed to keep the peace, must remember that such persons live, and that another Hitler, however insignificant he might seem as first, would have the power to arouse them. Without this realization there can be no real vigilance and no real promise of lasting



The woman who died here was known as Mrs. Alice W. Carpenter and a man who said he was her business agent caused the body to be cremated. The ashes now are being analyzed at the state police laboratories, Indianapolis, Ind.





#### FOR THE COMMON DEFENSE

TO fulfill its responsibility for protecting this Nation against foreign enemies, the Army must project its planning beyond the immediate future. In this connection I feel that I have a duty, a responsibility, to present publicly at this time my conception, from a military point of view, of what is required to prevent another international catastrophe.

We finish each bloody war with a feeling of acute revulsion against this savage form of human behavior, and yet on each occasion we confuse military preparedness with the causes of war and then drift almost deliberately into another catastrophe. This error of judgment was defined long ago by Washington. He proposed to endow this Nation at the outset with a policy which should have been a reasonable guarantee of our security for centuries. The cost of refusing his guidance is recorded in the sacrifice of life and in the accumulation of mountainous

We must start, I think, with a correction of the tragic misunderstanding that a security policy is a war policy. War has been defined by a people who have thought a lot about it—the Germans. They have started most of the recent ones. The German soldier-philosopher Clause witz described war as a special violent form of political action. Frederic of Prussia, who left Germany the belligerent legacy which has now destroyed her, viewed war as a device to enforce his will whether he was right or wrong. He held that with an invincible offensive military force he could win any political argument. This is the doctrine Hitler carried to the verge of complete success. It is the doctrine of Japan. It is a criminal doctrine, and like other forms of crime, it has cropped up again and again since man began to live with his neighbors in communities and nations. There has long been an effort to outlaw war for exactly the same reason that man has outlawed murder. But the law prohibiting murder does not of itself prevent murder. It must be enforced. 

America's Card Authority Sam P. Davis, with whom I used to play bridge in Cleveland some fifteen years ago, has been commuting for the past several years between White Plains and New York. They play bridge on the train, says Sam, and what bridge!

Here is an example he sent me. The opening one-heart bid was a good start, but it is difficult to say why West bid only two clubs When North bid three spades South passed because he did not think it was meant as a forcing bid, but as a pre-emptive one. When North bid four no trump, South woke up and realized that his partner was showing a big hand. He showed his two aces with the Black-



wood bid of five hearts, West put in another meek bid of six clubs, and now for the first time North came in with a rather weak six-spade

Once again, West could have passed the hand out, but decided nstead to make the grand sacrifice bid of seven clubs; but North took the gamble and bid seven spades. The bidding would lead one to beieve that the train may have gone off the track a couple of times. It was fortunate for North that West was not void in hearts. 




