### **G.E.D.** Tests To Be Given In Rule

General Education Development Tests will be given in Rule High School Saturday March 20, 1976 at 8:00 a.m. Five tests will be given in English, Literature, Social Studies, Science and Mathematics. If a person passes these five tests, the Texas Education Agency will issue a High School Equivalency Diploma. This diploma meets the educational requirement for

employment as well as partial requirement for College entrance or job training school. A fee of \$15 is charged for

all five tests and it takes about two hours for each test. A person must be eighteen (or at least 17 years old) and has been out of school one full calendar year. If a person is seventeen when the tests are taken the diploma will not be issued until the person is eighteen.

knows where to strike is by heat transmitted by the body, or if it's mad it will strike at motion. Note: There are two reasons for a rattlesnake to strike that is out of fear or because of hunger. Also it is not neccessary for the rattlesnake to sound his rattles before he strikes.

If you come across a rattlesnake don't panic, stay calm, stand still, then look around you, there may be more than one around you. Step back slowly, remember snakes strike at movement.

Always wear boots going out in an open field, snakes cannot penetrate leather. Snakes can strike above the boot, but you are safer than with a loafer. Although snakes strike only six to eight inches (normally) because of open terrain being uneven snakes can strike higher, example: If a snake happens to be on a 4 inch rock it can strike 4 inches higher.

Another interesting fact is that the strength of a snake is determined by the size of the snake. If you see a seven foot Western Diamond back rest assure his strike is powerful.

The rattlesnake is a curious creature. Take his mating habits for instance. The female rattlesnake has her own form of "women's lib" she can mate a male and then stop the cycle for months until she is ready and then when she chooses she fertilizes the eggs herself.

The baby rattlesnakes are born live from the mother snake and are already equipped. Contrary as it may seem baby rattlesnakes are more dangerous than their mother. The venom produced in sacs just behind the fangs becomes more potent with inactivity. Small snakes have not used their venom as yet and so the venom is stronger. Also the small snake is prey to owls, roadrunners, and other such varmin so they hunt smaller game and do not use their venom. Larger snakes on the other hand kill game as large as rabbits so their venom is "dulled" by use, but still deadly.

Q.: What do you do if you are bitten by a snake?

A.: According to Barney Barnett, fear is the most harmful effect of a snakebite. When bitten by a rattlesnake the situation calls for calm and collective thinking. If you are bitten your first impulse is to grab the first aid snakebite kit and begin wrapping the tourniquet as fast and as tight

#### commence to "Cutting the venom out.'

First: The tourniquet is harmful, the venom many times has already killed the skin surrounding the bite, if a tourniquet is applied is cuts off circulation which could result in gangrene.

Second: You do not know how deep the bite is. If you have a bite that only goes 1/8 inch and you begin cutting with 1/4 an inch knife blade you are spreading the venom deeper and faster into the blood stream. Also if you are nervous (which you generally are) you can cut arteries and other important veins in the process causing more damage than the bite itself.

The only instrument that you need is a suction cup provided in the snakebite kit. Most snake bites aren't serious if they are handled properly. If you are bitten apply the suction cup immediately, regulating the time for each puncture, stay calm, and sit down for an hour or two letting the suction draw the venom out of the same place that it went in to.

However: some bites are serious, in that case apply suction cup, remain calm, and consult a doctor immediately. If you remain calm your blood will not be circulating as rapidly carrying the venom through the blood stream, also you have at least 30 minutes before damage from the bite begins to set in. 





### Soil and Water Conservation Districts

The Soil Conservation Service has announced the reprinting of a widely used SCS publication, "Conquest of the Land Over 7000 Years." The author of the journal, written in 1942, was Dr. Walter Clay Lowdermilk, a pioneer in soil and water conservation.

In 1938, the U. S. Department of Agriculture commissioned Lowdermilk to make a survey of land use in the older European and Asian countries in the interest of conserving our own land resources.

'The land bears a record of what men write on it. . .a record easy to read by those who understand the simple language," Dr. Lowdermilk wrote.

In his tour of England, Holland, France, Italy, North Africa, and the Near East, Lowdermilk followed agriculture from its beginnings 7,000 gears ago to modern times.

He observed fields that had been in cultivation for thousands of years. The publication is a prophetic account of his search for reasons why land that once supported thousands of people now lays in abject waste.

The answer to his quest was soil erosion. He tells why erosion acted as a catalyst in the desecration and destruction of many advancing civilizations.

"One of the most important findings on this survey of the use of land through 7,000 years," Lowdermilk said in summation, "is that tillers of soil have encountered their greatest problem throughout the ages in trying to establish a permanent agriculture on sloping lands."

The publication, AIB-99, "Conquest of the Land Over 7,000 Years," is available from your local Soil Conservation Service office.

### **Direct Deposit For SS Checks**

COLLEGE STATION-Social security recipients now have a way to reduce the risk of being robbed of their checks-having them mailed directly to their bank; Lynn Bourland, family resource management specialist, says.

"Social security checks, or any other U. S. Treasury checks, may now be deposited directly into a person's checking or savings account.

'To make arrangements for this service, request a Form 1199 at the local bank or savings and loan office," she said.

Miss Bourland is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M

University System. 'Be sure to have the financial institution instructed to send any notices that come with the check to your home address. The Social Security Administration will keep both home address and address of the selected financial institution-but any message normally mailed with the Social Security check would be sent to the bank," she explained.





# **Retires** At **Texas A&M**

COLLEGE STATION-After having served 181/2 years as director of the Texas Agriculture Extension Service and 40 years as a professional agricultural educator, Dr. John E. Hutchinson is retiring, effective Feb. 29.

In announcing Hutchison's decision to retire, Dr. Jack K. Williams, president of The Texas A&M University System, said, "There is no way to estimate the value of the tremendous job John Hutchison has done. His service to the people of this state has been of the highest order. His dedication to the Extension Service and its basic role is

Currently educational prototal, and his commitment deep. We wish him every happiness in his retirement." At present, Hutchison has the longest continous span of service as Extension director in the nation.

Williams also announced that Dr. H. O. Kunkel, dean of agriculture at TAMU, will serve as acting director of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

"John Hutchison has been the architect of what has become the finest Cooperative Extension Service in the U.S.," added Kunkel. "Texas and its people will benefit from his efforts for a long, long time to come. His work, his dedication, his effectiveness simply have been great." Clyde H. Wells, chairman of the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents,

noted, "When John E. Hutchison retires as director of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service Feb. 29, our state will be losing one of its greatest public servants. His ability to organize and administer, his vision, his loyalty, his temperance and his love for mankind have made him the strongest among agricultural Extension

directors in America. He will be missed indeed.' Honors and public recognition given to Hutchison's leadership are many. In 1961 he was awarded the Superior Service Award from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. 





though that's where things are headed with the announcement by major air carriers that 747's are going to be converted to livestock haulers for international markets. Officials say live cattle transportation to countries outside North America is already 80 percent by air with both the volume and the percentage expected to increase during the coming years. For the animals themselves it's all first class. Interiors are redesigned and structured to resemble a barn with separate pens or stalls. Special temperature control and ventilation systems are being designed and separate studies are underway to determine other ways to increase animal comfort. No one has yet decided whether to include in-flight movies but it sounds as if they may not be far away.


Several Haskell High School speech students presented a program to Progressive Study Club last week which was decidedly patriotic.


