





Other Voices

(The following appeared as a letter to the editor of the Big Lake Wildcat. It applies to many communities.)

Editor: I am a business person in Big Lake and I feel that I have to reply to some of the statements made recently. First of all, there are many times that we merchants can also go to Angelo and purchase items at a discount store cheaper than we can buy them wholesale from our suppliers for the simple reason that we don't have several stores in different places to which we can divide and send trainloads of the same item.

Also I feel that you need to take into consideration that we employ your husbands and/or wives and children when we can. Our tax dollars are what supply the extras for your kids. We are the ones who donate to community organizations, who help you when there has been a tragedy in

I suggest that you jgo to San Angelo and ask for donations from your discount stores for the Booster Club, the Band, or to send a child to band camp whose parents can't afford it. Ask them to hold your check until payday, or better yet, given them a hot check and see how long they hold it before it goes to the county attorney's

Ask them to carry your charge account because your husband lost his job and you can't feed your kids. Be sure and get angry when you meet the manager on the street and he doesn't smile and say "Good morning, Mrs. Doe, how are you today?" He could be thinking how to meet his next payroll.

I don't live on Plaza or in Reagan View, never have, but I've lived in Big Lake for 20 years and I love this town and its people. My kids have grown up here and been treated well by these merchants. I shop here and sometimes pay more because I know these folks and I know that they stand by me and the other resident sof Big Lake through bad or good and you just can't put a price tag on that. If you could, I am certain that you could find it much cheaper in Big Lake than in San Angelo.

Everyone was elated that he was, going to get to go home. Everyone except me, that is. Christmas, and of course New Year's, was falling on Monday. Why spend five days of leave time? I asked myself. I was only 85 miles from home. We always got off at noon on Saturday, so I could go home Saturday afternoon, be off Sunday and Monday for Christmas and then repeat the same schedule the next week for New Year's. This way, I would be getting five days off without having any of it charged against my leave time.

Those fellows from Chicago and Milwaukee couldn't do it, but I convinced Gibbs, Hall and Ringo that it would work for them.

They thought it was a great idea. That is, they did until the Friday before Christmas when we learned that all four of us had been placed on stockade guard duty. It was a 24-hour shift from 6 p.m. on Christmas Eve until 6 p.m. Chirstmas Day.

We did have a Chirstmas dinner. We ate it with spoons in the stockade mess, along with the other "detainees."





First lights turned on 80 years ago

1906,---the first electric lights were "turned on" in Haskell.

The generating plant of Haskell Light, Ice and Water Company constructed during the summer and fall of that year, served fewer than 100 business and residential customers from the beginning.

The Free Press reported in the Dec. 22, 1906, issue:

"It was a new thing in the history of Haskell when at 6 o'clock Saturday evening the switch was turned in the power house of the Haskell Electric Light, Ice and Water Company and scores of electric lights flashed on, lighting the square with a brillance they had never known before, and giving them, as viewed through the plate glass windows, quite a city-like appearance."

The schedule of rates for electric service back then included:

16-candlepower lights, 1 light per month, \$1; 2 lights per month, \$1.85; 3 lights per month, \$2.50; additional lights, 50 cents per

The idea of electric service for the growing E to the old North Ward school building and

Eighty years ago this month---Dec. 15, city was first advanced by a group of two blocks west of the square, then north for 106,---the first electric lights were "turned prominent Haskell civic leaders and several blocks in the residence section." businessmen.

> Considered by many as a "big city" luxury, only a few merchants and citizens could be interested in the venture at first. The backers continued advocating establishment of the plant and on March 7, 1906, the Haskell Light, Ice and Water Company was organized with a capital stock of \$20,000.

> Directors of the newly formed concern were F. G. Alexander, J. T. Strickland, T. E. Ballard, H. G. McConnell, G. R. Couch, Joe Irby and M. Pierson. Alexander was elected president of the company. Pierson served as vice president and Couch as secretary and treasurer. In May of that year the company was granted a charter, machinery was ordered and construction of the plant building was

A generator of the old style direct current type, driven by steam power, was installed in a small brick and sheet iron building. Service lines were strung to the business section, around the square, extending north on Avenue

Although patrons at first were slow to take advantage of the convenience of electric service, within a few years service lines had been extended to practically all sections of town. After seven years operation by the local company, the plant was purchased in 1913 by G. T. Scales, Morgan Jones and W. G. Swenson of Abilene, with Scales taking over active management of the property. The name of the company was changed to Haskell Ice and Light Company.

New machinery was installed, including a new diesel engine and generators of the A-C type with auxiliary equipment to assure uninterrupted service.

During the next two years, transmission lines were built to adjoining towns, the first being completed between Haskell and Rule, with the lines later being extended to Weinert, Munday, Knox City and Goree.

In 1922, the Haskell property was purchased by West Texas Utilities Company.


DWI related death study is startling

A recently completed study of drivers killed in accidents in 10 Texas counties shows some startling facts:

More than half of them were drunk when they died. More than 60 percent had some measurable alcohol in their systems. And, based upon the limited data, despite the recent empahsis on the drunk-driving problem, there have been no significant reductions in such alcohol-related deaths in Texas.

The study, conducted for the highway department by the Texas Transportation Institute at Texas A&M University, analyzed blood concentration from a sample of fatally injured drivers in the 10 counties from 1983 through 1985. The study was conducted in the counties of Bexar, Dallas, El Paso, Galveston, Harris, Johnson, Nueces, Tarrant, Travis and Wichita.

Among the 60 percent who had consumed alcohol, the average blood alcohol concentration was nearly twice the legal limit of .10 percent.

'Lite' holiday diet suggestions

If you're dreaming of a "lite" Christmas that won't require a New Year's resolution to lose unwanted pounds, nutritionists with the Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service have the following

· Substitute ingredients to reduce fat and calories. Use low-fat dairy products and cut back on the sugar and fat in holiday cooking. Many recipes can be adjusted without a noticeable difference in taste.

· Change cooking methods to reduce fat. Start by staying away from fried foods. Steam, bake, boil or broil instead of frying. Use low-calorie, nostick aerosols or no-stick pans that require no fat for cooking. If you're making gravy for a holiday feast, skim off the fat.

· Eat more fiber. Fiber will satisfy your appetite without adding a lot of calories. Eat plenty of fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains and cereals so you won't want to fill up on rich desserts and other high calorie dishes.

· Eat slowly and reduce the size of your portions. Since it takes about 20 minutes before your stomach will feel satisfied, take at least that much time to eat your first helping. Then, perhaps you won't feel the need for seconds or thirds.

· Do some "calorie banking". If you anticipate a big splurge at one meal or party, save up some extra calories by eating nutritious, lowcalorie meals for several days in advance. Then treat yourself to the special occasion without worrying

The Extension nutritionists add that these practices are appropriate year-round and when coupled with regular exercise, can help you stay! within a healthful weight range.

Interior plastic storm windows can save energy



Old Christmas memories recalled ...

By Kathryn Medford

All my growing up years were spent on a farm in a German settlement in the North Central part of Texas. I was born during the midforties in a rural area. There wasn't a world of shopping centers, so at the Christmas season you didn't have a Santa Claus at every corner. He might arrive for a brief visit during the Christmas parade in the town nearest our farm. My first recollection of Santa Claus was not in town, but of him coming down the road from the field pulling a wagon with a doll bed therein.

Christmas was the high point of the year in my childhood memories. It was the only time of the year that we'd celebrate three days in a row...by celebrating I mean not to be gainfully busy with farm work beyond the cattle and chickens that had to be fed. We'd still busy ourselves the day of Christmas Eve with last minute house cleaning, coconut pie making and hair fixing. We'd usually spend Christmas Eve night with my Mother's family and sometimes in the same evening we'd also see my Dad's people who lived only about a mile away from Mother's folks.

Christmas," or worse yet, a wet one. When one had a mile and a half of dirt road to the highway and then about two more miles of "through the pasture road" to my Grandmother and Grandfather's home. If the weather should contain moisture you hoped it'd freeze the mud tracks so you could get out and stay frozen to get back in.

Christmas Eve was the time we had our church Sunday School program in my early years. At first these programs were held at the two-room schoolchurch at the center of the community. This site only consisted of the schoolchurch, a small country store, a small clutter of houses and a row of rural mailboxes. Today the old store stands alone and abandoned, one house or so remains empty now, the old school is gone, as are the mailboxes, only a partial rock fence remains to mark a time past.

Many times I was selected to portray an angel to "bring glad tidings of a great joy" in a church or school program...not that I was blessed with angelic characteristics or features. However, my Mother had made some superb wings in her time of helping

These were always the dread of a "real white" made on a cardboard base, covered with Even though I spoke a slang form of white crepe paper fashioned with individual feather like petals and then sprinkled with glitter.

After Sunday School presentation, I'd ride to my Grandparents' home with a favorite aunt and fellow cousins if they'd come home that time or they'd ride with me. We kids were put on a cardboard table off in the bedroom next to the kitchen. In those early years you hoped that someone had put on the kettle so the water would be hot and the men folk would volunteer to get a bucket of water as needed. All this was so the clean-up wouldn't be delayed so we could open gifts. We couldn't open gifts til all were fed and dishes done, and we'd sing, in that order.

As years passed, I moved from the cardboard table to the second one. I began to enjoy the sheer joy of being with kin who were also dear friends. Material gifts of the occasion came to not be my first priority. That old white frame house appearing in the midst of a cow pasture clearing became alive with the voices and laughter of everyone reminiscing of years gone by. I, too, wondered what it would have been like to be one of ten kids growing up together in that house.

Then there was the time after supper dishes and before gifts when that whole bunch would gather in the dining room to sing Christmas carols. We'd always sing a line or two of "Oh Christmas Tree" (Oh Tannenbaun) and

Even though I spoke a slang form of the language, I never got much past the first line of either and mouthed the rest. Then we'd close with Silent

Then the whole place became a mass of paper and boxes as gifts were handed out. Everyone tried to find a corner in order to keep their things together. Later in the evening some settled down to play 42 and 84...while the rest just caught up on visiting. Or in the early years before fireworks had the reputation they have today, we'd get a young at heart uncle or aunt to help us set off our own display of skyrockets and Roman candles while some watched from the screened porch.

Before indoor plumbing, the ladies took turns making trips in twos usually to the ole 2-holer...probably doing some private conversing going and coming. Our "citified" cousins feared the snakes and spiders and such, I think they missed something of the magic of the occasion as the old farming buildings, trees and farm equipment were silhouetted against a clear star filled moonlite night.

Years have passed and I grew up. I moved away from my hometown...and I have spent many Christmases away from the old "Out Home" setting, but memories of those first years live on in my heart.

Oldsters can postpone taxes

Homeowners 65 or older can postpone paying delinquent property taxes on their homesteads by taking advantage of a tax option called "Over-65 Deferral." The elderly homeowner simply signs a deferral affidavit at the Haskell County Appraisal District

The special form of tax relief can also halt a lawsuite already filed to collect delinquent property taxes on an older Texan's homestead, according to John Grissom, ohief appraiser of the Haskell County Appraisal District. To stop a delinquent tax suit, Grissom said the over-65 homeowner files the deferral affidavit with the court in which the suit is pending.

'The law means that, if the proper affidavit is on file, an older homeowner files the deferral affidavit with the court in which the suit is

This law means that, if the proper affidavit is on file, an older homeowner cannot lose a homestead because of delinquent taxes," Grissom



tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, no taxing unit can initiate or pursue a suit for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and lives at that homestead.


Grissom stressed, though, that tax deferral for the elderly only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the homestead; it does not cancel them. During the deferral period, taxes and delinquent penalties and interest continue to add up, he said. "When the elderly taxpayer no longer owns or lives in the home, those accrued amounts become due," he said. "Taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred tax, penalty and interest."

Forms for filing a tax deferral affidavit are available at the appraisal district office. "The homeowner should fill out the form and have the signature witnessed by a notary public," Grissom said.

Clarence Callaway, owner of Callaway's Hik'ry Pit Barbecue, admits he knew virtually nothing about the food business when he bought his

restaurant 10 years ago.

"I had been a pharmaceutical salesman for 13 years and one night I sat down and figured I had spent six and a half of those years on the road away from my family. I wanted to spend more time with my wife and our son and daughter so I told my wife I had to find something else.

"I had coffee here almost every morning with a friend, and he told me the owner wanted to sell. I went to see him at 8 a.m. the next morning and by noon I owned the place," Callaway

Callaway had previous experience in the restaurant business. He worked as assistant manager of a cafeteria, where he learned to be a butcher, while attending Midwestern State University.

Someone once asked me why I bought this place when I didn't know anything about the business, but I told him I didn't know anything about pharaceuticals when I started selling them either, and I don't have to drive 50,000 miles a year doing this," Callaway said.

The Haskell native came here in 1955 after graduating from high school where he played offensive wingback and defensive safety for the football team. This instilled a love of sports that carries over today.

He is a staunch supporter of the athletic teams at Wichita Falls high schools, especially their football

For the past few years, he has managed to combine his love of football with his devotion to Rider High School where his son, Scott, played. On the Raiders' road trips, he caters the team's pre-game meal.

"We usually stop at a roadside park and I bake potatoes to go with the brisket. The team piles off their buses and eat and they're on their way. Some members of the booster club help out. It's a lot of fun, and I guess you could say it's one of my favorite hobbies,"

Aside from his work, Callaway's passions are golf and racing pigeons. Even though he doesn't get to play much any more---"I played golf every day when we went to Colorado on vacation and only once since we got back"---Callaway still carries about a 10 handicap.

His love of football and support of the Rider Raiders got him into racing

Coach (Morris) Mercer got me interested. I've got about 85 now. I get the joy of feeding and caring for them, and since I have to work, my wife gets the fun of clocking them in when they come home," Callaway said.

Today, Callaway can claim a great deal of experience in cooking. His restaurant will use from 12 to 15 70pound boxes of brisket a week, not to mention numerous turkeys (this holiday season, he'll smoke 300 to 500 of the birds).

I don't get many orders for Thanksgiving because everyone wants to try their hand at fixing one, but they really flock in for Christmas. I guess people discover what a mess and bother it is and don't want to go through it again," Callaway said.

"Despite the long hours of working from 6:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. six days a week, Callaway enjoys his work, he

"It's not really catering. We prepare all the food and they pick it up," he

While brisket is still the most popular item on his menu, Callaway said turkey is gaining in popularity because of its low cholesteral content.

And his favorite food?

"I eat an awful lot of barbecue as you can see, but I guess I'd have to say Mexican food," he said.

And does he have any regrets about leaving his job as a traveling salesman and getting into the restaurant business?

"The only regret I have is not having done it sooner," he said, pouring himself another cup of coffee.



Fans costly in winter

A whole-house fan is an energy saver for homeowners in west and north Texas during the summer months, but an energy loser during the winter.

"Because the hinged louvers in most whole-house fans don't provide an effective air seal or insulation, heat from the house escapes into the attic," says Dr. Susan Quiring, a housing specialist with Texas A&M.

"Unless you find some way to seal up the fan, you use more heat than you need to and pay higher utility bills," she adds. Quiring says a simple method for sealing the fan is to go into the attic and cover the fan with fiberglass batts. Then use plastic or heat shrink film to seal over the louvers from inside the house.

Kits with plastic for this purpose are available at many discount and hardware stores.
