# City to Impose Water Residents

Extremely hot weather the past week or so and high water consumption have put a strain on the water treatment plant, making it impossible for the facilities to provide enough water to meet the demands.

The announcement was made Tuesday by city officials that steps must be taken to alleviate the situation and they came up with a voluntary plan, asking the cooperation of everyone in Robert Lee in putting it into effect.

The city fathers said they "certainly don't want to place regulations into effect which endanger yards and gardens. They came up with the following schedule which will allow everyone to water three days each week.

Water Supt. Bob Large told The Observer Tuesday afternoon that the daily consumption during the past several days has averaged 630,000

gallons. On some days it has reached the 674,000 gallon mark. This compares with

last year when on only 10 days during June, July and August the water use reached 600,000


### **Progress Made** On New Clinic




