One of the most important provisions of the bill is that which prohibits absolutely the cancellation or consolidation of leases before their expiration. The law has ever been that the land was on the market on the expiration of a lease if in demand for settlement, and this was in line with all of the history of land matters in Texas, which conclusively show that it has been the intention of our laws since the days of the Republic to favor the actual settler. However by means of the cancellation and consolidation of leases before their expiration a system had been ingeni ously devised which formed a kind of an endless chain of leases. by which the leases were renewed before their expi ration, and this effectively prevented the land from coming on the market for sale to actual settlers, and avoid the intended.
