Kansas City, Feb. 17, 1902. Receipts here the past week have been very light. Prices scored a sharp advance and values now being realized are the highest of the season. Foday choice fed lambs averaging 70 lbs. brought $\$ 6.50$. Yea ling wethers fed roo days sold at $\$ 6.50$, while muttons and ewes mixed went at $\$ 5.50$ and straight cwes at $\$ 4.75$. These prices compare very favorably with other river markets. Quotations at this point and South St. Joseph are practically the same. and the difference between the figures either being paid here or at St. Joseph and Chicago is so small that it does not pay to go forward with stock. We confident'y expect this condition of affairs will continue throughout the scason. At present choice lambs are worth $\$ 6.75 \mathrm{in}$ Chicag~; muttons, $\$ 5.25$; ewes, $\$ 4.7$ to $\$ 5.00$; yearlings, $\$ 6.00$. . s , ve have stated before, we have implicit faith in the future and fully believe prospects very encouraging for still higher prices in the near future.

There is no cbange in either the scate or Federal quarantine lines this season tie many reports to the contrary not withstanding. The following letter from Livestock Sanitary Commissioner Hankins makes that matter perfectly

The Kansas City Drovers Tylegram says on the subject
Some misunderstanding among cat. themen exists in regard to the order re cently isned by the Department of $A$ g riculture and received here yesterday. making certail modifications of the cattle quarantine line, and extendiag a special quarantine over certaiu countios in Texas where infected cattle aro lo. cated. Speaking of the new order, known as B. A. I. order No. 93, which is effective February 1. Col. Albert Dean, ivestock agent in charge at Kausas City for the burean of animal iadustry, whose jarixdiction extends over the entire Sonthwest country, aid today:
-The only permanent change in the quarantine line in Kusas City's terri terntorv lyiug betweea the present terntorv lying between the present
quarantine line and the rigit-of way of the Santa Fe railroal is left out of the quarantine district and made clean ter nitory
-Owing to the presence of Texas fever ticks in a mamber of Texas connties just outsive the quarantine line it wate recommended by the department and agreed to by the Texas state an. thorities that a temprary quarame shonld be placed upon these counties. Tue permanent quarabitue liay in Texas has not been changed. It rem ins where it has beea heretofore, but a special quatantine, which may be terminated at any time by agreement between the Deparment of Ahriculture and the state anthorities, has been placed upon these certain Texas counties and upon Greer county, U. T. The Toxas conuties now ontside, or above, the quarantine line, whteh will be after February 1, and until such time as the temporary quarantine is raised, within the quarantine district, are Childress, Cottle. Hardeman Fuard gibace King, Knox. Haskell, Stonewahl, Jones Fisher, Scurry, Garza, Bordeb, How ard. Mitchell, Glarscock, Sterling.
West Tow Green West Tom Green, Irion. Upton and Crane. A special quarantine is also placed on the counties of Throckmorton and Baylor, which are below the quar. antine, but in which there have been: number of clean herds.
"During the existence of this tempo rary quarantine no cattle can be woved from the counties so quarantined for interstate shipment except on federal inspection, and none can le moved to other parts of Texas above the guarantine line except on state inspection Cattle cannot be moved into these counties from below the quarantine live except on state inspection. At the time of the passage of the late land law the attention of the publi was so ixed upon the one feature of the bill relating to the canceliation of leases bill were for that reason it may attelion, and for that reason it may not be inappry rriate at this time to refor to some of the change-3 made. Cartain changes and their efinet are briefly noted as foliows:
The applicant to purchase land is permitted to file his application with the clerk of the coanty where the land is situated, and he is there furnished by records the clerik is obliged to keep and exhibit all necessa:y information on the exhibit all necessaty mormation on the subject. The penaties imposed and
the particularity of this section of the statute makes this provision for the first time effective. It also avoids delay, and greatly facilitates and lessens the work of the general land wifice and gives the people in all things better service.
Not over four sections of sehool land can be sold to the same upplicant, i. e when a party has nuder thi- law boaght his four sections he can buy no more and his application to purchase most aftrmatively show his prior purchaser

This was intended to prevent favoritism and had been the rule all the time with reference to applications to parchas lands. It is also provided that no new case shat issue for a longer term that years,
"Detached lands" can no longer be sold except to actual settlers, as other school i.anls are sold. Tuis ca oof the specnlator and those who broupht about the detachmeat of lands in order to purchase without settlement. an? the object of the provisiou was to prevent rauds on the state
One of the most important provisions of the bill is that which prohibit a :abso Intely the cancellation or consolibation of leases before their expiration. The law has ever beea that the land was on the market on the expiration of a leas if in demand for settlement, and this was in line with all of the history of land matters in Texas, which concla. sively show that it has been the inten tion of our lawe riact the days of the Republic to faver the actual setther However by mauns of the cancellation and consolidation of leases before their expiration a system had been ingeni ously devised which formed a kind of an endless chain of leases. by which the leases were renewed before their expi ration, and this effectively prevented the land from coming on the market for sale to actual settlers, and avoid the very object for which the law had been iatended.
