

BEE HIVES

The most satisfactory material packing. by far for the use in the manufac ture of bechives is white pine. No other wood has been found that is a satisfactory substitute. The first reason for the use of White Pine is because it is totally odorless. The owner of a large cold storage plant in San Autonio was telling the writer just the other day that the inside of all storage, rooms where food stuff's are held in a half frozen state for months, must be lined, walls, ceiling and floors with an inch of clear white pine because it is the only wood that will not give off and neither will. it absorb any odors.
