Messages of Consul Silliman at Vera Cruz and Consular Agent Carothers at Chihuahua told of the receipt of copies of President Wilson's statement announcing that unless the military factions themselves succeeded in composing their differences and restoring constitutional government, the United States would be obliged to find other means of accomplishing this end. It is supposed Consul Silliman handed a copy to General Carranza, but Carothers may not be able to reach Villa immediately. A copy for Roque Gonzales Garza, provisional president of the Villa-Zapata government in the City of Mexica, was sent to the Brazilian minister for delivery.


