

"No, dearie," replied her father. "Ith it the thecretary of aggriculture?"

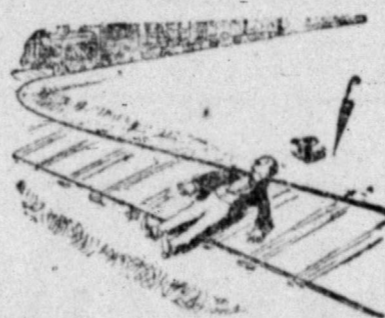

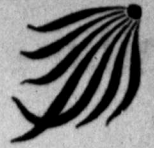

## GEORGE BOWLES

TELLS OF A BATTLE OF GIANTS AND TALKS OF MODERN POLITICAL METHODS

Austin, Tex. Jan. 28.—The people who read newspapers think they keep pretty well up on current events, and they do, but when it comes to the matter of knowing the real facts of modern politics the average reading man or woman learns a lot of theoretical politics and very little of the real working ability of a great political machine. Texas has really known very little about the modern art of politics, as applied in her own affairs, until the unfortunate episode that will go into history as the Bailey controversy, arose upon the scene and put all previous contests out of the reckoning as sensational politics.

In the press reports of that great battle for political mastery the average reader has gotten an idea that some wonderful speeches have been made and that oratory and party fealty have resulted in a great political victory. Now the press reports of this matter, like the press reports of other absorbing current events, have been handled by men of wonderful ability, but modern journalism has reached

such a stage that none but the man who keeps pace with modern methods can fully comprehend it any more than a layman can take up the thread of a learned scientific discourse and follow it to a satisfactory conclusion. So powerful is the political machine that has been used in this instance that the people whom it is supposed to represent have no idea of its magnitude. The greatest evidence of this fact is that the people have actually been led to believe that they had a hand in the matter, in other words the modern political art of making people "see things they don't see" has been carried to such an extreme in this case that men who have been recognized as political leaders in Texas have gone entirely off their feet and will one day awake to the fact that they have signally failed to "guess which shell the pea was under". I do not mean by this to cast any reflection upon the men who lead the forces upon either side of the fight. Good men as Texas has were on each side and many of them were sincere in the belief that their theory of the matter was the only safe one for the Democratic party and for Texas. The man who attempts to read both sides of a great political "joust" such as this has been is likely to be like the lawyer who arose in court and told the judge he thought the witness was lying under a misapprehension of the facts in the case, or like the opposing counsel who gravely stated that he "didn't know how the witness was lying, but felt sure that he was lying like Annanias." To the man who does not dig deep it looks, after reading both sides of the case, like "somebody's lied", but the real facts seem to be that the prime effort being put

forth just now is to keep from being caught. Nearly everybody who goes on the public rostrum in political contests makes statements that the facts in the case won't justify. That is just about what has happened in this instance and when the people wake up right good to the situation they are going to call for a balancing of the books, and they will come mighty close to finding out to whom credit is due and when they do find out everybody will get just what is coming to him.

Of course every man who fights tries to discredit his adversary while the battle is on, but when it is over he admits the valor and bravery of his antagonist. Every person of intelligence knows that Texas has been witnessing for the past three weeks a real "Battle of Giants" and when giants fight they always "tear the ground up." Whether this agitation has been for the best interest of the country can only be seen by the passage of time, but it is very likely to result in making some people at least a little more careful.

The Gentleman from Kerr and myself got back to Austin in time for roll call Monday morning, and though I have not heard him say so I am sure he is pining already for another look at the brown hills and green valleys of the Guadalupe. The house got down to business today passed two or three bills. There is a big lot of new members here this session and things don't seem to start off right smooth. It reminded me of how they used to net the old 'ground hog' thresher when I was a boy. They would get it put together by noon, run through a few bundles and then spend the balance of the day putting "rawsum" on the belts and talking about

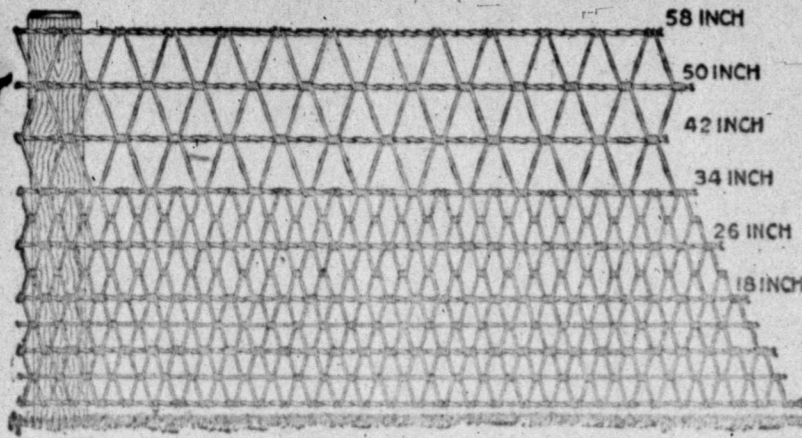

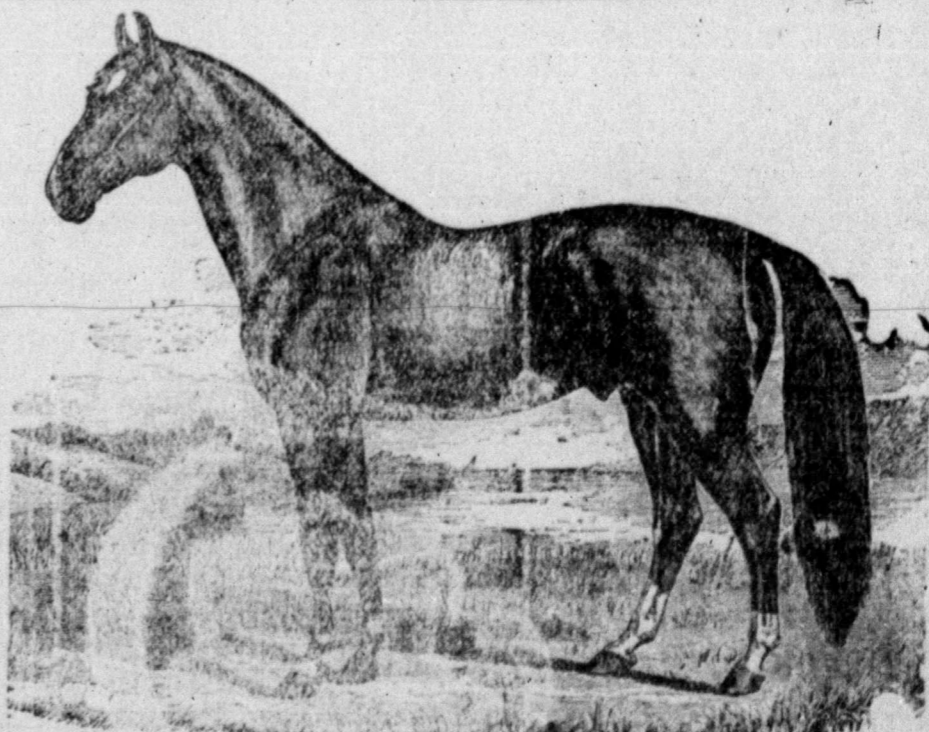

Heart trouble was the cause of his death. The funeral occurred Wednesday evening at Glen Rest Cemetery, and a large concourse of friends and relatives attended.
