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

Pipes of Redwood.

The decay-resisting properties of the California redwood, which have made it a favorite building material on the Pacific coast, have recently led to its use for irrigation pipes and conductors for hyro-electric power plants. For this purpose the wood is cut in long staves which are fitted together like those of a barrel and firmly banded. Some of the pipes are carried across deep canons and gorges as well as through trenches underground. They are even used to some extent in the eastern states. The chief source of supply is the great forests in the neighborhood of San Francisco bay, which are estimated to cover about half a million acres .-- Cleveland Leader.




