

Local boards of health could do this if they had sufficient money to hire competent doctors or school burses, but boards of health are proverbially "hard up," and usually have not enough available money. Boards of education could employ doctors or nurses, but boards of education are also often insufficiently supplied with money.

School teachers can do this work without additional expense. Instructions have been published in periodicals and books many times, and the plan is perfectly easy and practical. 
