Soon after sunrise the units of the expedition started to assemble on the sand dunes. First came the General Staff, then the headquarters company and then the infantry. At 9:30 a. m. the long thin line of the column started off, with the supply wagons of the infantry companies forming dark spots against a curtain of smoke from the burning camp at Palomas Lakes.

Swinging along the high road with the morning sun glistening from their rifle barrels, trudged the infantry. The hebnailed shoes sounded on the pebble road like the wash of waves on a seashore.

The infantrymen's faces were covered with desert dust and their field kits caked with the powdery silt from the road, which had been pulverized by hundreds of passing motor trucks.

At 11 o'clock General Pershing mounted the little bandstand in front of the headquarters at Columbus and began his farewell review of his troops while the band played "When Johnnie Comes Marching Home."

Hard as nails, the expeditionary soldiers passed in review like the functioning of a perfectly made machine. After the infantry came the cavalry column. Behind rumbled the artillery with the pack trains, sanitary corps, ambulances and other auxiliary units.






