We should buy at home when possible, because it is to our best interests to build up home industries in the town in which we live.





Detroit, April 29.—Ford automo-bile and tractor interests will be combined and re-incorporated as a \$100, 000,000 Delaware corporation, it was indicated today as the result of papers submitted to the Secretary of

The corporate powers of the company, according to these papers, will permit it to engage in the manufacture of aircraft, internal combustion locomotives and all manner of vehicles used in transportation. The reason for incorporating under the Delaware laws, it is said, is that organization of a company with more than \$50,000,000 capital stock is not permitted in Michigan.

It is believed that the capital stock of the new company will not be opened to public sale, but that it will be held by the incorporators of the Henry Ford & Son corporation.


