



## INTER-CHURCH MOVEMENT ABANDONS CAMPAIGN

New York, June 29 .- The billiondollar campaign of the Inter-Church World Movement has ben abandoned. it was announced today, following a meeting of the executive committee. The entire project may end July 8, it was said, when the general committee will meet to consider what steps, if any, will be taken to carry on the other aspects of the campaign.

Several reasons were back of the lecision, the committee stated, the principal one being the present prevalence of "drives" of various kinds which are being carried on throughout

With the withdrawal of the Baptist Church, North, and the Presbyterian Church, North, also were said to be important factors. Originally the Inter-Church World Movement proposed to direct the raising of \$1,320,-214,551 for the work at home and abroad of the 58 boards and societies which became parties of the movement. For the first year, 1920, the budget called for \$336,777,572, which was to be raised by a drive closely patterned after Liberty Loan methods between April 21 and May 20, last.




