#### ESTIMATE SAYS 1,500,000 ARE NOW IDLE IN EUROPE

London. - Strikes and slackened business in Europe have left 1,500,000

Exact figures were not available, but the British Labor Ministry put the number of unemployed at 1,500, 000, as a conservative estimate.

In Great Britain there are 200,000 men drawing unemployment pay from the government, but there are tens of thousands more who have not benefit-

Thus far there haz been no suffering. The weather has been mild. At the same time there is worry over prospects for the winter. The government has urged unions to admit unskilled labor to their ranks, especially in the building trades, which the government plans to use this winter in the construction of buildings.

Later estimates of unemployment in reat Britain were placed at 403,000. Germany's idle army is estimated at 400,000. Of these many are receiving government rations. Strikes have been frequent in Germany but much of the unemployment has been involuntary. France has about 200, 000 unemployed.

There were no statistics from Italy, Austria or Central Europe, but conditions were known to be bad




