

# Cleanup Work Continues By Santa Fe R.R.

Santa Fe Railway trains were back on schedule early Wednesday morning, July 17, approximately two and onehalf days after 15 cars, loaded with 30-35 semi-tractor trailers, derailed just east of Bovina around 2 p.m. Sunday, July 14. Until the tracks could be cleared of debris, all trains were being re-routed through Lubbock.

Clean-up of the area was halted last week when a train at Higgins derailed and the crews were pulled from the Bovina site and taken to Oklahoma to restore train service there. Clean-up resumed sometime Monday when part of the crew returned and the rest of the crew returned on Tuesday.

Clean-up of the area is being conducted by Messer Enterprises of Hereford, who have hired a number of people to help go through the wreckage and salvage anything possible. Messer has also purchased all damaged equipment and contents of the trailers, to be sold to individuals at a later date.

It has been estimated that there were 126,000 United Parcel Service packages aboard the train and of those 126,000 packages, 56,000 have been salvaged.

According to Mel Clark, who is working with the local Sheriff's Department and Messer Enterprises, the area is being guarded 24 hours a day to keep people away from the wreckage. He stated that there have been approximately 100 rattlesnakes found in the area during the clean-up, but luckily no one has been bitten. He is asking that onlookers stay away from the area for their own safety.

Estimated clean-up of the area and damages will be close to four million dollars.
