A BAD MAN IN CUSTODY

Triple Murderer is Run Down by Sheriff Owen After a Hunt of Four Years

After a man hunt which lasted for four years Sheriff J. W. Owen passed through here yesterday morning with his man in irons enoute to the jail at Lincoln, where he will be held for the May term of h : District Court.

Four years ago F. Gomez, a water tender for a sheep herder at Los Palos, killed a fellow employe in cold blood.

There had been trouble between the two men and on the morning of the killing Gomez crept up behind his companion, who was bending over a fire just kindled, and shot him to death. The body fell into the fire. The murderer then pulled the dead min away a distance of and then left the country.

Sher ff Owen traced Gamez to a

point several miles below El Paso whe. he lost track of him and it is supposed that he went over into Mexico. The hant was given up. for a time, but Sheriff Owen was constantly on the lookout for trac s of his man, and several days ago be dearned the fugitive had returned to the American side of the Rio Grande and was then at Colorado City Texas, He immediately re. newed his efforts to bring the marderer to justice with the above stated result.

Gomez is half Mexican and half regro and a notoriously bad man. Twelve years ago he killed a man at a point some ten miles below El Paso on the river and shortly after that another at San Antonio in this territory. Chance for the Boys

A letter has just been received at this office from Professor J. J. Version, of the New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, announcing the intenton to hold a corn growing contest for boys. Laberal cash prizes are to be offered and free seed will be furnished from the Station Farm to anyone writing them that they wish to enter the contest.

Professor Vernon writes that the matter is being taken up with the county superintendents of schools and that an effort will b made to get as large a number of boys interested in the contest as possible from all parts of the territory.

It seems to as that this is a very good thing and should receive the support of everyone who is interested in the development of the resources of the territory. A contest of this kind, in addition to encouraging the boys to spend their time in some useful occupaion, will show in a substantia! way, what can be done in New Mexico in the way of farming. Then, too, what fine exhibits, can be secured from the patches of corn tended for this contest to exhibit at the Teraitorial Fair. If the boys of Lincoln County get busy in the corn growing line this spring we will be able to surprise the visitors from Kansas and Iowa this fall and there is no good reason why our county may not get a share of those prizes.

Right in this connection we will take the liberty to say that this valley should have a rousing exhibit at the Territorial Fair next fall and it is none too soon to bogin planning for it.

· Cash Advertising

It is said that the Santa Fe Railway has sent out cash advertising contracts to thousands of papers along its lines. At this time no exact figures as to the amount the company will pay on these contracts can be given, but it is estimated that it will run as high as \$150,000 per year. This is exclusive of the large amount required to execute contracts in some of the large cities.

The country press is liberally represented and it is believed that when the plan has had a fair trial it will be preferred to the former transportation arrangement.

The fact of the rope being taken down from the saddle is an indication that he got off of his horse and sat down by the roadside and died of heart failure,

> The deceased was a respected citizen, and one of the oldest inhabitants of the county, being past 70 years of age.

> The body was taken to Capitan for interment, after the inquest, by his sons who were notified as son as the death was known,

UNLAWFUL FENCES

The following order of the Department of the Interior being a matter of general interest throughout the territory, we publish it for the benefit of our readers.

DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, Secretary's Office.

Washington, D. C. Jan. 3. 1907, Commissioner, General Land Office Sir: Referring to the circular of instructions to special agents of your office, approved by me February 29, 1904, relative to their duties under the act of February 25, 1885. entitled, "An act to prevent unlawful occupency of the public lands." you are advised that said circular

follows. Strike out from said circular paragraphs 5 and 6 and insert in hea

thereof the following.

It shall be the duty of the special agent on receipt of any charge or complaint or upon information being acquired by him from any source, that an unlawful inclosure is being maintained by any person or persons, association or croporation, to at once proceed to secure sufficient data, including a describe tion of the lands inclosed, with reasonable certainty, not necessari. ly by metes and bounds, nor by Governmental subdivisions of surclosure may be identified and the person or persons guilty of the vioressonable inquiry, be obtained and data thus obtained' to the United gtates attorney for prosecution.

It shall be the duty of the special agent, and he shall be so instructed to be alert and vigilant to detect the existence of unlawful inclosures in his district, and proceed in accordance with the above directions, and he is not to construe his duties as requiring that there must be a

formal complaint fited before he can act, but it shall be his duty, to above stated to take the initiative himselt.
