state of Texas passed a law establishing a State Fire Rating Board, which Board establishes rates for Fire Insurance in Texas and prescribes conditions under which the same may be written. The Fire Insurance Companies have no say as to how a policy shall be written or what rate shall be charged as that is fixed by The State Rating Board. The following is a copy of one of the paragraphs of he law: "Sec. 7. No Fire Insurance Company shall engage or participate in the insurance of any property located in this State unless the schedules of rates under which such property is insured has been filed in accordance with the provisions of this act; nor shall any Fire Insurance Company knowingly write any insurance at a rate different than the rate named in its schedules subject to the provisions of Section 6 hereof, or re be of from 15 to 20 tons daily fund or remit in any manner of capacity. Be sure the bit is not so narrow as to irritate and pain the mouth of the horse. Such condition leads to uneasiness, which often may result in the horse taking the bit in his teeth and bolting in sheer desperation.

Docking Lambs.

A good plan to pursue in docking lambs is as follows: Tie a cord tightiy about the lamb's tail one inch from the body. With a pair of pruning shears clip off the tail just below the cord. Rub carbolated vaseline on the wound and remove the string at night.





THE PRIME MINISTER. Foreign Sovereign Responsible For This English Official. So long as the sovereign himself presided at the meetings of the cabinet there was no obvious necessity for giv ing any member of it precedence over the others. But from the accession of the house of Hanover the king ceased to take part in the deliberations of the cabinet. It has been said, indeed, by a modern statesman that, "with a doubtful exception in the time of George 111., no sovereign has been present at a meeting of the cabinet since Anne.' The change, like so many other modifications which have been introduced into the British constitution, was the result of a purely accidental circumstance. George I, could not speak the English language. It was clearly useless for a monarch to be present at the meetings of his councilors when he did not understand the language in which their deliberations were carried But when the sovereign was thus necessarily and habitually absent from the cabinet it became requisite that ome minister should be chosen who should preside at the meetings and report its decisions to the king. Thus e accession of a foreigner who could ot converse in English led to one of the most momentous changes in the onstitution.
