#### ROAD IS NOT ASSURED


Brady Has So Far Failed to Subscribe Required Amount of Stock in Coleman-Brady Proposition.

The Standard regrets its inability to announce this week that Brady has secured beyond doubt the new railroad from Coleman to Llano. While we have realized the great importance to this city of securing this road, and while we have expressed confidence in Brady's enterprise and ability in this connection, yet we have been conservative in our statements, and all other press reports to the contrary notwithstanding, The Standard has never stated that Mr. Love's proposition had been finally accepted and the road





#### Taking The Census.

Census Supervisor Nat M. Washer, whose office is at Washer Bldg. San Antonio, has received from the Census Bureau a supply of blank applications for persons applying for positions as census euumerater. These will be forwarded to his list of applicants as soon as possiable

The applications, properly filled out, must be returned to the Supervisor not later than January 31, the Census Director having extended the time for filing from January 25, which was the date first set for closing the consideration of applications. The "test" will occur February , as previously announced.

Indorsements of each appliant must be secured from two representative citizens of the community in which the appliant resides. They must be at least 21 years of age and acquainted with the applicant not less than one year. Indorse ments will not be accepted from any person who is in any way reated to an applicant. The indorsement certifies that the applicant "is a thoroughly trustworthy and honest person, of good habits, and in my opinion, is fully capable of discharging the duties of a census enumerator, if appointed."


