BANK CONTRACT IS LET

Local Firm of Contractors Will Build the New \$15,000 Home for the Brady National Bank.

Messrs. Wright & Horn, a firm of Brady contractors, have been awarded the contract for the erection of the new home for the Brady National Bank which will occupy a site 50x90 feet on the southeast corner of the square. Work on the excavations will begin in about ten days, and the bank officials hope to be domiciled in their new quarters by the first of October.

This building will be the handsomest business structure in the city. It will cost about \$15,000, and considered with the site the bank's new home will represent an investment of more than \$25,000, exclusive of furniture and fixtures.

The bank building proper will be 30x90 feet, and two stories in height with a basement in which will be located a steam heating plant which will supply heat for the entire ouilding. The additional twenty feet will be one story in height and will be used for a business house. 
