Preliminary Survey Completed From Boerne to Mason .--- Crops Fine in that Region.

Mr. John Fowler reached here this week from Mason. He has been with the surveying crew of the North & South road for the past two months. He says when he left the surveying crew was camped about five miles from Mason and have reached there by this time. This crew was in charge of Engineer Holiday. They had succeeded in locating a route with a one per cent grade the entire distance.

Capt. Streber, who has charge of the surveying crew from Boerne to Fredericksburg, has completed his work and is now at the latter place. Mr. Holiday will return to Fredericksburg as soon as he reaches Mason. The surveyors will then go over their route again for a final or locating survey. When this is completed the company will be ready to let the contracts for grading.



A Few Changes Made in Results as Printed Tuesday---Smith is Commissioner Instead of Finlay. Total Vote 1,463.

The delayed returns from Stacy and Bear Creek came in yes terday and Chairman J. W. Matthews has completed the official count which is given in the table below, the figures being final. The Stacy box gave Smith sufficient lead over Finlay to make his election a fact, his majority over the Fife man being three votes. There are some other minor changes from our report of Tuesday, and the total vote polled in the county is 1,463.

Returns from all over this representative district are not available, yet the election of Hamilton over Jones is conceded by a fote of something like two to one. Hamilton carried McCulloch and Lampasas by big majorities.

BIG PROFITS IN HOGS

There Are Only Two Classes of Men Who Do Not Succeed in the Hog

There are, in fact, only two classes of men who can not profitably grow hogs. The first class is composed of those who will make no provision for the feeding and care of their animals; who expect them to pick up a living through the summer and then to be fattened on corn in the fall and winter, or who keep them shut up in a filthy little pen the year round, feeding them on unwholesome slops and high-priced corn that has been shipped from the West. The other class is made up of those men who can not understand that any farm animal, even the pig, is entitled to good treatment, and some consideration of his wants-men who do not realize that if the hog is to produce pork cheaply he must be made comfortable, and that when it is a question of getting a profit out of the pig. the pig's wishes, rather than those of his owner, are the first to be consid-

The pig wants several things, and these he must have if he is to produce pork cheaply; he must have good feed and plenty of it; he must have pure, fresh water to drink; he must have clean quarters and enough range to keep him active and healthy; he must have shade in hot weather and he must be kept free from lice so that what he eats will go to the building up of his own body instead of feeding those parasites .- Starkville (Miss.) 
