## REBUILDING SYSTEM

Work Progressing on Improvements for Brady Telephone Exchange—Town Will be Cabled.

J. J. Paxton has sold a one-half interest in the Brady Telephone Exchange to his brother-in-law, C. A. Fancher, who recently moved here from South Texas. The change will have no effect on the contemplated improvements to be made, except, perhaps, to hasten the work to completion.

Mr. Paxton informs The Standard that about \$12,000 will be expended on the system, and that the work will be completed within 60 to 90 days. Besides the five miles of cable already bought, a large quantity of copper wire and other materials have been purchased, and the work will be pushed rapidly.

New poles are being set in the alleys in the business district, and the network of wires on the square and business streets will be removed. The cables will be strung all over town, and when the work is completed Brady will have as complete a system as it is possible to build.

Mr. Paxton assures the public that these improvements will be made as rapidly as men and money can do the work. The firm has ample ready capital in bank for the purpose.

## DEATH OF A PIONEER

Judge G. W. Jones of Rochelle, First County Judge of McCulloch County, Dies of Heart Failure.

Judge G. W. Jones, a pioneer citizen of McCulloch county, and the first county judge the county had, died at his home in Rochelle Thursday night and was buried in the Rochelle cemetery Saturday.

About midnight Thursday night a fire broke out in Miller's confectionery store and the store and a blacksmith shop adjoining were destroyed. Judge Jones was awakened and attended the fire, and the unwonted exercise and excitement proved too much for his age. He was stricken with an attack of heart failure and died at 1:00 a. m.

Judge Jones was more than eighty years old, and was looked upon as one of McCulloch county's best citizens. He was respected by all and was a man of great influence in his community, and that influence was always exerted for good. He came to this country in an early day, when the Indians roamed the prairies and the West was a wilderness, and when McCulloch county was organized he was elected county judge.

He leaves several grown children and a host of friends to mourn his loss.

Gus Jones, an employe of the telephone exchange, while unloading poles Friday had his hand quite badly mashed and is laid up for repairs in consequence.

The Brady compress is now making two runs a week. Up to Monday night about 1250 bales had been pressed. Manager McCracken expects to press about 10,000 bales this season.

The Richey-DeFrest Land Company on Monday started a crew of surveyors to work platting the new townsite to be known as Whiteland. This plat lies at the junction of the Frisco and Santa Fe roads, about ten miles west of Brady.

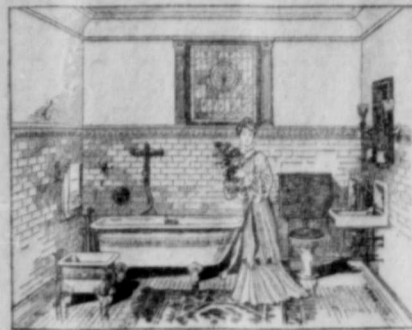
