## BRIDGE BONDS CARRY

Incomplete Returns Indicate That All the Five Bridges Carried by Good Majorities.

The election for bridge bonds held Saturday brought out a good vote at all the boxes so far heard from. The Brady box polled 325 votes, probably the heaviest vote ever polled here on a bond election. This box gave a good majority to each of the five propositions.

The Standard has not returns sufficient to give tabulated returns for this issue, but will try and obtain same for the Friday paper.

We understand that Stacy, Milburn and Mercury gave majorities for the bridges, while Placid, Camp San Saba and Calf Creek voted against them. Waldrip gave a solid vote for their own bridge, and two to one for the bridge at Voca, but rolled up good majorities against the other three propositions.

We understand that no election was held at Rochelle, and that a move is on foot in that locality to contest the election on the ground that notice of election was not properly posted. However, we have nothing official on

this report, giving it just as we heard it in the county clerk's office Tuesday morning.

## DRAKE INSPECTS LINE

Vice President of Frisco Makes Automobile Trip From Brady to Menard. Work Progressing Well.

Vice President and General Manager W. B. Drake, and Live Stock Agent E. F. Tillman, came in on the noon train Saturday and left immediately in Mr. Tillman's auto for a trip of inspection over the Menard extension. They returned to town Monday.

During the past several weeks the work on this extension has progressed rapidly, and the Frisco is making heroic efforts to give the good people of Menard train service for a Christmas present. They hope to succeed in this effort, and as the grade is very nearly completed it is possible that they will do so.

Billy Bevans of Menard, a banker, merchant and cattleman, who was chairman of the committee of Menard county ranchers and business men which raised the bonus to get the extension of the road, announced in Fort Worth Friday for the first time the agreement the committee really had with the Frisco officials. The committee had specific reasons for keeping the matter a secret, but recently the bonus fund was made complete and is soon to be turned over to the road.

The Frisco is to be given a side bonus of \$10,000 in addition to rightofway between Brady and Menard, a distance of over forty miles.

Since the Frisco started work on the project and completed the grade within three miles of Melvin that portion has been sold to the Santa Fe. Although the two lines are to operate this track jointly, an agreement has just been reached with Menard citizens who contributed the rightofway, whereby they are to be refunded the exact money used in the purchase of that strip of land.

The recent letter to the citizens of Alice from B. F. Yoakum of the Frisco, wherein he states specifically that the Frisco will conduct no more building in Texas until the International & Great Northern claim bill is either amended or appealed, has created a great deal of discussion among Menard and Kimble county ranchmen and business men, so Mr. Bevans says. It is understood that the original plans of the Frisco called for the extension of the road beyond Menard and land owners and business men in every county adjoining are eager for the road to go their way.

"Practically all the residents of Menard and Menard county were against the passage of this bill, and Mr. Yoakum's declaration was not a great surprise," said Mr. Bevans.

"While the people down our way have not the least doubt but that construction of the road will stop at Menard for a while, at least," continued the visitor, "it is supposed that the line will some time be connected with the San Antonio & Aransas Pass at Kerrville. It is not very far from Menard to Kerrville, and an entrance to San Antonio would be of great value to the road."

#### Warning.

I have had my book "List of Taxpayers of McCulloch County," copyrighted and shall avail myself of all protection the laws of the United States give. The United States copyright laws are very strict against infringements. Any list purporting to be a list of the taxpayers of McCulloch county gotten out for profit, whether in manuscript, type written, mimeographed, or printed, will be treated as an infringement. The making or using of such infringing copy is a violation of the federal laws. The U. S. Marshal is authorized to seize all such infringing copies together with the plates or devices from which they are made, and to deliver them to the U. S. Court for destruction.

Section 1 of the copyright law is as follows: Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that any person entitled thereto upon complying with the provisions of this act, shall have the exclusive right to print, reprint, publish, copy and vend the copyrighted work.

Section 25 says: That if any person shall infringe the copyright in any work protected under the copyright laws of the United States, such person shall be liable to pay to the copyright proprietor damages not to exceed the sum of five thousand dollars nor to be less than the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, and shall not be regarded as a penalty.

Section 28. That any person who willfully and for profit shall infringe any copyright secured by this act, or who shall knowingly and willfully aid or abet such infringement, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by imprisonment not exceeding one year, or by fine of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.

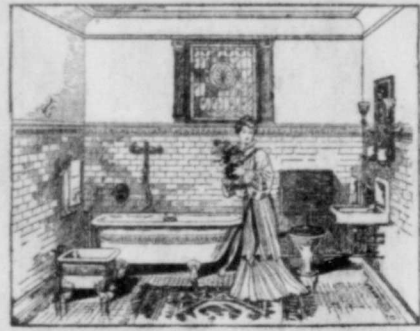

Deputy State Game Warden Drew Taylor has returned from a trip to Kimble county, where he raided the violators of the game law and succeeded in putting under bond twenty-two well-to-do citizens, among them being state representatives, the county clerk and attorney. Mr. Taylor says he was commissioned by the State Game Warden to go to the Junction City country to make investigations, and he went there presumably to purchase a hog ranch. He was shown various and sundry plats suitable for such an industry and while the land agents were busy he was likewise busy with the violators of the law and when he had gained a great deal of information he made complaints and put twenty-two of the representative citizens under bond to await the action of the grand jury.

Mr. Taylor says the state game warden received information that the law was being flagrantly violated there and that he was sent to make inquiry into the matter. He says the people there pay very little attention to the law and kill deer out of season. He reports that in one instance he found some fifteen or twenty mounted antlers which he seized after they had been offered for sale. He says a great many mounted antlers have been sold and that he will get the purchaser just the same as the seller. —Brownwood Bulletin, Oct. 1.
