## \$20,000 BRICK DEPOT

Santa Fe Officials Here Yesterday Locate Depot Grounds and Promise Handsome Passenger Station.

A special train carrying a big bunch of Santa Fe officials, came in over the Frisco from Brownwood yesterday and spent the day in Brady. Among the visitors were Vice President & General Manager F. G. Pettibone, General Superintendent Maxon, General Freight Agent Hirsch, Assistant Freight Agent Keith, General Passenger Agent W. S. Keenan, Chief Engineer F. Merritt, and Assistant Engineer Temple.

The party are out on a tour of inspection of the company's several new lines, and had just come from a trip over the Sterling City branch. They inspected the Santa Fe's Brady property, looked into some rightof-way matters and were shown over the city. A part of the crowd returned on the special to Brownwood while others took automobiles for a trip to San Saba and Lometa.

The item of most importance in connection with this visit was the selection of sites for the passenger and freight depots in Brady. The passenger station will be located on the west side of Bridge street, immediately opposite the Morrow Hotel building, while the freight depot will occupy ground immediately north of the Perry gin and on the east of Bridge street. Members of the local railway committee were informed by the officials that Brady would be treated handsomely in the matter of a passenger station. It will cost about \$20,000 and will be constructed of brick, and they expect to make it one of the handsomest stations on their line. The company will spend a small fortune on improvements on their Brady yards, with passenger and freight depots, sidings, etc. They say they like Brady and are anticipating a fine business out of this point, and they will construct their improvements accordingly.

If certain rightofway matters between San Saba and Lometa are straightened out the Santa Fe ought to be running trains into Brady by January 1, 1911. However, there is still considerable grading to be done to the east, and the exact time of completion is hard to determine.

The Brady Oil Mill advertised a reception for the ladies at their plant for last Thursday, but the inclement weather prevented the carrying out of their plans.

A. H. Conner has been very ill the past week, and for several days last week his life was despaired of. The Standard is glad to report a great improvement in his condition at this writing.

Mr. O. L. Clark, Land and Tax Commissioner for the Santa Fe railway company, was here last Friday checking up the local railway committee on matters pertaining to rightofway. Mr. Clark stated that if all local committees were like Brady's he would be out of a job, for he found absolutely nothing to do. He complimented Brady highly and said that the McCulloch county rightofway was in the best shape of any county in the state. This was Mr. Clark's first visit to Brady, and he was highly pleased with our town and its future outlook.

## SPECIAL AGENT HER

John T. Love, Special Agent Farmers Co-Operative Demonstration Work Locates in Brady.

John T. Love, a practical farmer from Johnson county, has been assigned by the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture to McCulloch county, and arrived Saturday to begin his work as special agent for McCulloch county in the Farmers' Co-Operative Demonstration work. Mr. Love will move his family here within the next ten days.

The plan of the co-operative demonstration work is, or should be, too well known to well-read farmers everywhere to require explanation at our hands. Mr. Love is busy now preparing a list of those farmers who are willing to join hands with the department of agriculture in this co-operative system. Under the terms of the contract a farmer agrees to devote from one to ten acres to the work, preparing the seed bed, planting selected seed and cultivating the crop under the direction of the department and under the supervision of Mr. Love as local agent. There is no risk to be taken, and much to be gained in knowledge.

Mr. Love desires thirty or forty farmers, each with one to ten acres. Up to date he has secured agreements from sixteen, and he feels that there will be no difficulty in interesting as many as he will have time to superintend.

Mr. Love comes here as a direct result of the efforts of the Brady Commercial Club, which body is putting up several hundred dollars to supplement the government's appropriation. The Standard trusts that he will meet with a hearty welcome from our farmers, and we believe that the results of his work here will be something worth while.

## WHITELAND TOWNSITE

New Town Now Platted and Improvements Scheduled to Begin—Big Lumber Yard Secured.

Manager J. H. Beckham, of the Richey-DeFreest Land Co., reports having received information from the head office at Fort Worth to the effect that the Bowman Lumber Company had purchased six lots near the center of the new townsite, Whiteland, and were under contract to establish a big lumber yard immediately. Twelve cars of lumber will be shipped at once and the Frisco has agreed to handle the shipment within two weeks. The first car will contain materials for the erection of lumber sheds and office for the yard. The investment will be about \$10,000.

Mr. Beckham reports that Surveyor Doty is about through with his work of platting the townsite, and active selling of the property will begin at once. The town is situated at the junction of the Frisco and Santa Fe roads about ten miles west of Brady, and the promoters confidently expect to build a good town, believing the location admirable.

## NORTH WARD SCHOOL EXPERT BUILDER HERE

School is Opened in the New Building Monday With Three Teachers and an Enrollment of 105.

As announced last week, the North Ward Building was ready for occupancy Monday morning and the grades and teachers assigned thereto transferred their belongings and were soon at work with everything running smoothly.

The total enrollment for the North Ward Building the first day was 105. Miss Graham has in her room 19 first graders and 16 second graders. Miss McCollum has 18 third graders and 14 fourth graders. All these children are members of families living on the north side of the creek. Mrs. Wilson has the entire sixth grade in her room, numbering 38 pupils, from all sections of the city.

At the high school building the grades are divided as follows: Mrs. Allen, 42 low firsts.

Miss Doole, 25 high firsts and 16 low seconds.

Miss Low, 27 high seconds and 15 low thirds.

Miss Duke, 19 low thirds and 20 high thirds.

Miss Blackman, 16 high thirds and 25 low fourths.

Miss Hill, 24 high fourths and 20 low fifths.

Miss Fletcher, 22 low fifths and 20 high fifths.

Miss Massey, entire seventh grade.

The High School is arranged on the departmental plan with four teachers and about 90 pupils.

Two or three hundred dollars worth of additional scientific apparatus has been ordered and is expected to be ready for use next week. Special attention will be paid to the Science department hereafter, and the school will do affiliated work in this line, something heretofore impossible on account of insufficient equipment.

Superintendent Wilson states that the enrollment is increasing steadily, and that he is well pleased with the arrangement as relates to the division of the grades, and believes it to be the best obtainable.

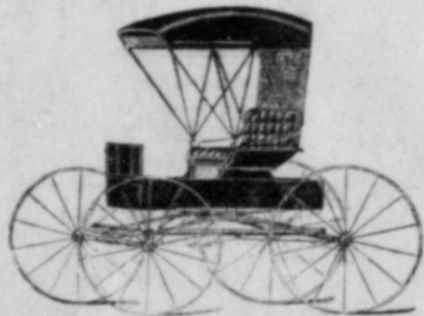

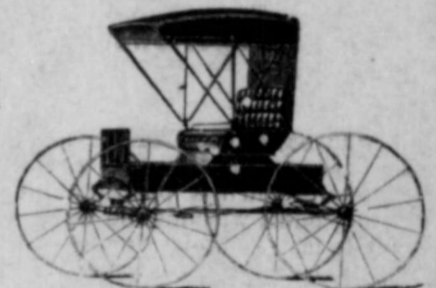
