When he has eaten everything that was put before him. At the prices given it would be better to feed the barley rather than to sell it and buy middlings. The barley, however, should be ground into a fine meal and fed in the form of a slop. It is well to remember that a variety of feeds is better than a ration made up of one or two feeds, and with this in view it might prove advantageous to sell some of the barley and get a little middlings so as to have a ration made up of corn, barley and middlings Prices 25c, 50c and \$1.00. ADVISE TO GET BUSY

Farmers Should Increase Their Stock and Breed Better Strains.

Get busy and raise hogs is about as good advice as this paper can give to its farmer readers, and it therefore advises such action. There are not enough hogs in the country to supply demands, and the demand is increasing so rapidly that it will require more than a year of lively breeding to put the hog supply of the country on a level with the demand for pork products. That being true, it follows that hog prices will continue so high that there will be money in the business.

Illinois is short on hogs this year. Indiana is short. Iowa is short and Missouri. Kansas, Nebraska, Ohio and Minnesota are all short the number of hogs in some of the states named being nearly 50 per cent less than at this time a year ago, and this is in the face of increased demand for pork products.

Do not attempt to raise more piga than you can handle well, else they will eat up all the profit. Care of the hoge does not mean feeding alone, but in giving them attention necessary keep them in good health.

The hog lot should be changed and plowed up frequently, as disease germs are likely to be deposited in the ground and plowing sweetens the soil.

Chemical Engine Shipped.

The city council has received the bill lading for the chemical fire engine recently purchased. It was shipped from Elmira, N. Y., on the 6th, and will arrive about the 20th.

This is a fine machine, and of the same pattern as is used in Dallas. In fact, Mayor Conley asserts that he was informed by the Dallas Chief, that this engine extinguishes two-thirds of the fires in Dallas. This will be a great addition to Brady's fire department, and will give protection to the residence districts as well as the business portion of town. Arrangements have been made to keep the machine at the garage of the Brady Auto Co., and this company will pull it by auto to fires.





STRICT CORN DIET SHORT IN PROTEIN

The specific effects of corn as an only feed as evidenced by the growth of young swine in tests conducted by the Missouri agricultural experiment station are, in general, a retarded de-velopment of proteid and bony tissues and an over-development of fatty tis-

This results in the production of fine-boned, poorly-muscled, undersized and over-fat animals, which reach their limit of growth prematurely, and which are characterized by less than normal breeding capacity. Impaired fecundity seems to result from discouragement of proteid suit from discouragement of proteid increase generally, and from the lessened circulation of blood in the female productive organs, this last being caused by pressure of the excessive amounts of internal fat which accomplishes when those parts

sive amounts of internal fat which accumulate about those parts.

With hogs fed on corn alone the bones, muscles, liver, kidneys, lungs, heart and spleen all compose an abnormally small proportion of the increase in weight, and fat composes an abnormally large part of the increase. The muscles of corn-fed hogs are high in fat, and low in protein and in water; but the percentage of water in the fat free meat is decidedly high. The proportion of ash oprotein in the flesh of exclusively corn-fed hogs, however, is not low. The livers of corn-fed hogs are small and low in ash and phosphorus.

Compared with rations containing

Compared with rations containing more protein. corn produces small, at kidneys. The low-proteid corn ration makes less extensive requirements, and so produces less development of the kidneys than other rations containing more protein. This has a bearing on the feeding of growing ambinals. The eliminative functions of the body will not reach full deevlopment if the animal be reared on a minimum protein allowance. The bones likewise are small, and lacking both in density, as indicated by ash

The younger the animal, or the greater the amount or proportion of protein in the increase in a given time, the less nearly is corn a perfect food for animals.

PROLIFIC BREEDERS SHOULD HEAD HERD

In an address delivered at a meeting of the Texas Swine Breeders' Aseociation, H. W. Kelly urged the im-portance of maintaining the prolif-leacy of sows and pointed out how this could be done. Among other things he

said:
"The important thing in maintain-"The important thing in maintaining the prolificacy of sows is to select a sow for breeding purposes that is of a prolific family. The pig that is intended for a brood sow should be fed well enough to keep her in good condition, but not extra fat. She should always have plenty of exercise: in fact she should have to in a large measure root for her living. It is easier for the owner and better for the hog that it get a large portion of its feed from the fields and pastures and from such other things as acorns, and from such other things as acorns, grasses, oats, peas, sorghum, etc.

"A gilt that is expected to be kept for a brood sow should never be bred before she is eight months old, and it is better to wait until she is ten or eleven months old. Then when she farrows she should be a large and strong mother—one large and strong enough to raise a good litter of pigs.

"The boar should always receive

consideration, as well as the He should have a mixed feed and plenty of exercise, but may be kept a little fatter than the sow. "Keeping and feeding a lot of brood "Keeping and feeding a lot of brood sows from year to year is very expensive, therefore the fewer sows you can keep to raise the number of pigs you want, the more profit you make. You can't afford to kep a sow four or five months to raise four or five pigs. If you have given her the proper attention and she does not have a good litter, it is best to get rid of her and try other sows, for there are pienty of them that will raise from six to a dozen pigs at a litter."

PROFIT IN FEEDING HIGH-PRICED WHEAT

That there is profit in feeding wheat to hogs is the claim made by James Withycombe, an Oregon swine grower, and in a communication to the Port-

and in a communication to the Portland Oregonian he shows on what he bases his claim. He says:
"For example, it is reported that some of the Umatilla county farmers are selling their wheat for 75 cents a bushel. At this price the farmers doubtless secure a good margin of profit. But at the same time there are train loads of 10-cent Nebraska hogs passing through their farms. Why not at least feed some of this wheat to hogs? It has been demonstrated time and again that it requires four and one-half pounds of wheat to produce one pound of live pork. This means that a bushel of wheat when transformed into 10-cent pork is worth \$1.32 per bushel.

"Better results than this can be secured from wheat when hogs are economically grown. If hogs are grown largely upon alfalfa or pastured on winter rye or wheat they can be brown to a fattening stage. tured on winter rye or wheat they can be brought to a fattening stage at a cost of about 4 cents per pound. As an illustration we will say a hog can be made to weigh in the fall from pasture and a small supplemental feed of grain, 150 pounds, costing \$6. He is then fed 450 pounds of wheat and weighs 250 pounds and is worth at the present market value 9 cents per pound, or \$22.50, thus giving a gross return to the farmer for 450 rounds of wheat \$16.50, or \$2.20 per bushel. Even with pork at 7 cents per pound there is good money in the industry by feeding 75-cent wheat.

New Dust Layer. Vice Consul W. Washington Bruns-

wick furnishes the following information concerning experiments made in Chempitz with a German anti-dust sprinkler:

During the last summer extensive experiments were made with "anti staubit" to prevent dusty roads in Chemnitz. The material was bought by the city from potash works at Aschersleben and cost \$26.18 per metric ton of 22,046 pounds. The autistaubit is sprinkled over the road by means of the ordinary street sprinkling cart. After carefully cleaning the street and moistening the material with water it is thus strewn when first applied, and for each square meter about one kilo (2.2 pounds per 10.8 square feet) is required. All subsequent sprinkling is done with a solution of 50 per cent water. According to the experience of the Chemnitz street cleaning department, the dust preventing effect of anti-staubit lasted from twelve to twenty-four days, according to the amount of traffic and cart. The hog choiera demonstration held at the Omaha stock yards under the direction of the United States government experts has ended. The four original choiera pigs used in the test all died in due course of time. Of the eight healthy pigs turned in with them five died and two others were stolen, presumably by some person not aware of the test being made, and that they were sick with choiera. The eighth pig has recovered. His growth was arrested during the test and he is not as large as he was at the beginning of the demonstration.

On the other hand the eighteen 1 gs that were vaccinated with the anticholera serum at the time they were turned in with the sick pigs have none of them shown the slightest signs of hog choiern, but on the contrary have made a good growth and are as thrifty a bunch of hogs as any one could ask for, although running in the same pen with pigs that were dying with choiera. Dr. W. B. Niles, who vaccinated the hogs, is in charge of the government's station at Ames, lows.

Iowa Government veterinarians say that the farmers are already pretty well satisfied as to the practicability of the serum method of treatment for hog cholera, and what they most need is not information, but an enlarged supply of the serum. There are plenty of farmers who will use the serum if the state was prepared to supply it. This device consists of a hollow pole set upright, firmly in the center of the hog pen. The hollow is filled with petroleum, the pole being perforated, numerous small holes permitting the oil to seep from the hollow to the outside.

The mechanism of the pole is so arranged that when the hog rubs against the pole the oil oozes onto it and thus the animal oils itself and practically takes care of itself, so far as the lice proposition is concerned. The exhibit is attracting much attention from the farmers and all who have seen it believe that it is a most practical invention.




