WILL BUILD BRIDGES

Coleman County Commissioners Decide to Come Through With Their Share of the Necessary Funds.

The visit of the McCulloch County Commissioners Court to Coleman last week was productive of results, in that the Coleman county officials decided to issue interest bearing certificates of indebtedness with which to raise their share of the necessary money for the Stacy and Waldrip bridges.

The contracts for the bridges were let to the Missouri Bridge & Iron Co., and completion of both bridges is guaranteed in eight months. The contract price for the Stacy bridge is \$21,484, and for the Waldrip bridge \$15,896.

McCulloch county has already provided for her half of the expense by bond issues in the sums of \$11,000 and \$10,000 respectively. Coleman county voted down the bond issues, and the action of the Coleman court is in keeping with the law allowing interest bearing certificates to be issued. They will pay \$3000 cash and a similar amount each year until the indebtedness is cancelled.
