





Commercial Corner

The agricultural interests of the country have experienced a great loss in the death of Dr. S. A. Knapp, of the Agricultural Department at Washington. Dr. Knapp has done more for the farming interests in a practical way, than any man who has ever occupied that position under our Federal Government. Especially does he have the respect of the people of Texas. Wednesday was set apart by our U. S. Agricultural directors of this State, as a day for the suspension of all activities, and mourning by all demonstrators.

At no time in the history of our state has the "back to the soil" fever been so effective. Land is going up by jumps every month, and the farmer is coming into his own. 




