May will be the terminus of the road for the present, but within the next two years it will be extended to connect with the Central at some point farther on and probably will go to the T & P The coming of the road to May is but the realization of the fondest hopes of the May people. They have been patient in their efforts to secure railway connections and now that they have this connection it is expected that the little village will soon become a city of impor-


