Mrs. E. E. Spiller, who has been spending several months in Columbus Ky., visiting her parents and friends, returned Monday.

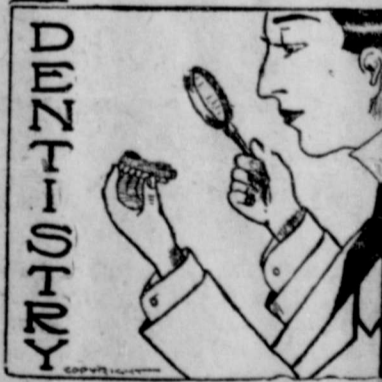
Mrs. Lillie F. Beasley, who is charge of the school at Mertry, was in Brady Saturday and Sunday visiting relatives.

## MEXICANS IN TROUBLE

### AGED MEXICANS QUARREL AND ONE IS SHOT.

#### Wounded Man Not Expected to Live—Assailant Voluntarily Surrenders.

As a result of a quarrel in the Dodge community, Juan Tovara, a Mexican 67 years of age, is at the point of death from a gun shot wound received at the hands of Calletano Mota, another Mexican. The latter states that cattle belonging to the former were allowed to get into his field and the two quarreled over this. Tovara started trouble, it is claimed, by throwing rocks at Mota, whereupon the latter shot him, the charge crushing his arm into a pulp. While the trouble occurred Friday morning about 10 o'clock, the officers and a doctor were not notified until late in the day. The Mexican refused to allow his arm to be amputated, with the result that gangrene set in, and it is doubtful if he recovers. His assailant voluntarily surrendered and is confined in the county jail awaiting the outcome of the injuries.

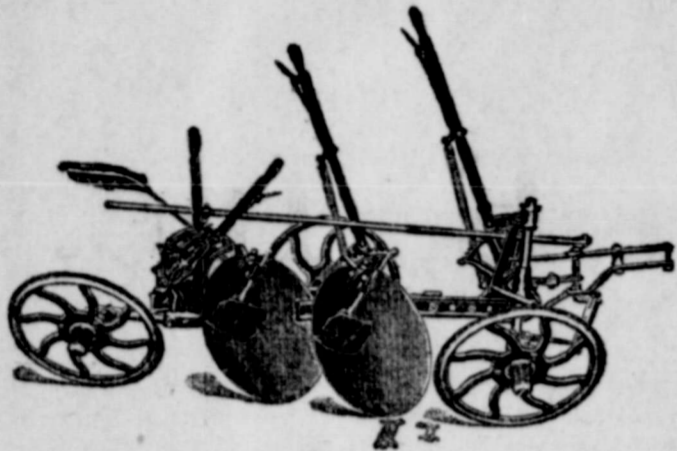

## BAD NEGRO IS KILLED

CARY BROWN SHOT BY SHERIFF WALL.

Negro Had Been Drinking and Causing Trouble—Armed With 44 Self-Acting Gun.

Cary Brown, colored, was shot and fatally wounded last Friday night between 7 and 8 o'clock by Sheriff Wall, and died from the effects of the wound Sunday night at about the same hour.

The negro, who was employed as cook at the Yeager boarding house, had been drinking, and causing trouble at the Yeager home. He had failed to get supper for the boarders, and taking it for granted that the boarders were dissatisfied had made a number of remarks about them, interspersing his remarks freely with curses. Several of the boarders went to him and warned him to stop. He became so incensed at this that he left the house going to town, where he armed himself with a self-acting 44 gun and started back toward the house with the evident purpose of shooting the ones who had remonstrated with him.

Meanwhile the boarders had notified Sheriff Wall of the negro's action, and Mr. Wall was on the lookout. The negro was going toward the Yeager residence in a fast walk when sighted, and Mr. Wall halted him in front of Shropshire's drug store, and attempted to search him. The negro protested that he wasn't armed, and wrenching himself free ran out into the square. Mr. Wall had drawn his gun and as the negro ran struck at him with the butt end of it in the hopes of felling him, but missed the blow. After running a few steps the negro suddenly wheeled and drew his gun, and at the same moment Wall fired, the bullet striking Brown in the left side and coming out through the pit of his stomach. Brown relaxed his hold on his gun, dropping it in the street, but maintained enough vitality to run around the corner of the First State Bank, where he fell.

The negro was carried to the colored hotel, and a physician called, who pronounced the wound fatal. Brown lingered until Sunday night. The body was shipped to Brownwood for burial. The negro came here from Stephenville, where it is said he had a reputation as a "bad nigger." He was married and leaves a large family. Four cartridges were found in the gun dropped, which bore out the supposition that the negro was out for trouble.

The examining trial of Sheriff Wall on the charge of shooting Brown was held before Judge Harvey Walker in county court Monday afternoon, and Wall was acquitted, as there was no doubt whatever as to his acting in self-defense.
