Murderer Captured by Deputy Sheriff Latta After Being Dangerously Wounded.

One of the most atrocious murders ever enacted in Brady occurred Sunday. Tivrisio Hernandez, a Mexican, shot and instantly killed a Mexican woman named Genoveda Rodriges. The weapon used was a 25-20 Winchester rifle. There was but one eye-witness to the tragedy, another Mexican woman, but several parties heard the shots and were on the scene almost immediately, and in a short time a large crowd had collected. Holding the crowd at bay with his rifle, the Mexican slowly made his way out north of the Sessions pasture by Deputy Sheriff Oscar Latta, who called upon him to halt three times. 
