



# **What's The Matter** With Your Baby?

Secretary of Commercial Club Gives Views.

The Lohn community in Mc-Culloch county is getting into the spot light as a probable petroleum field. From the number of real oil men who are coming to look over the field and the interest they manifest, it is reasonable to suppose that with proper development this will become famous as an oil section. As much depends upon the beginning of things, especially if they accomplish great things, great care should be given by the land owners to whom they lease their lands. For the whole country to be taken up in leases by men wholly unable to develop them, means that the fields will drop back to agricultural prices and nothing but farms will be the result. But with an eye to the men who are able to do something with the options when obtained, it will be possible to get quick development, and substantial men at the head of the enterprise. This means much to the whole country . It means so much that this advice should be well considered.

If the country is all taken by men unable to get deep wells, and thereby give the fields a fair test, there will be no opportunity for the real men to get there to bring results.

A deep well proposition is a serious thing financially; therefore, men are slow to take so serious a risk without some assurance of profitable returns.
