Have been spending a few days sight-seeing in and around Rock Island and other little towns near by. Oh, how I long to be an artist or some great poet of old, that I might paint the scenes before my eyes, of the great valleys with all their radiant glory ! <br> Am longing for the time to come when I can visit my Brady friends, whom I will always remember. The happy days I spent in Brady will always be remembered and bring happy thoughts to my mind, and sweet dreams to my memory. I must say to you Brady people that you have a land of sunshine. I cannot say too many good things about Brady and the Brady people, for it is a model little city. Brady bids fair to be one of the best cities of the West.
